**April 19, 2010:** Over 3,000 fans watch GSU's inaugural Spring Scrimmage at Georgia Dome.

**Aug. 23, 2010:** Before ever playing a game, Georgia State football is featured on the cover of ESPN the Magazine.

**2011 Season:** Georgia State plays as FCS Independent.

**April 9, 2012:** Georgia State announces move to FBS, accepts invitation to join the Sun Belt Conference on July 1, 2013.

**April 21, 2012:** Christo Bilukidi is first Panther drafted by NFL (Oakland Raiders, 6th Round).

**2012 Season:** GSU begins FBS transition and plays its only season of CAA Football.

**Sept. 10, 2012:** Christo Bilukidi is first GSU football alumnus to play in NFL regular-season game.

**Dec. 3, 2012:** Trent Miles is introduced as Georgia State's second head coach.

**July 1, 2013:** Georgia State Athletics officially returns to the Sun Belt Conference.

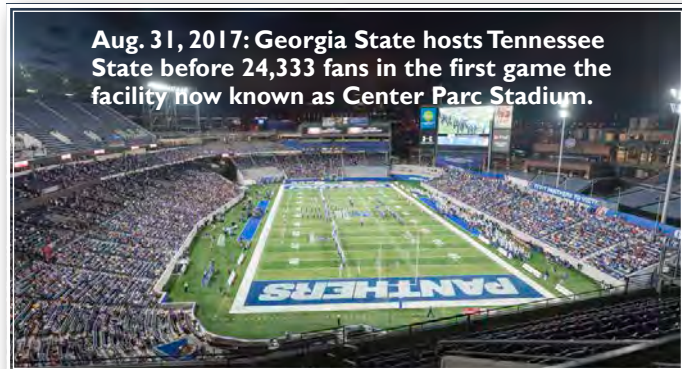

# “PETE” PETIT FIELD AT **CENTER PARC STADIUM**

*HOME OF THE GEORGIA STATE PANTHERS*





**CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM** is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field and venue for Major League Baseball's Atlanta Braves, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Park Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers enter their seventh season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.



Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games, including the Opening and Closing Ceremonies and the track and field competition. Ground was broken on the stadium on July 10, 1993.

Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in the conversion to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The first baseball game at Turner Field was played on April 4, 1997 as the Braves defeated the Chicago Cubs 5-4. The stadium hosted the National League Division Series a total of 11 times (1997–2005, 2010, 2013) and the NL Championship Series four times (1997–1999, 2001), as well as one World Series (1999), one NL Wild Card Game (2012, the first in baseball history), and the 2000 MLB All-Star Game.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field, a 1-0 victory over the Detroit Tigers, on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

# CENTER PARC STADIUM



**THE STRICKLAND LOCKER ROOM** at Center Parc Stadium covers nearly 7,500 square feet. It is 55 yards long and 15 yards wide. It also features:

- \* 115 lockers and 19 televisions
- \* Custom Panther logo stitched into the carpet
- \* Hydration area
- \* Center-lit helmet cabinet in each locker, along with power, USB connections and ventilation system to dry gear.





# OPERATIONS SUITE



With the opening of the Football Operations Suite in 2019, the football program is completely housed at Center Parc Stadium. The facilities feature the team's strength and conditioning center as well as the team and position meeting rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and



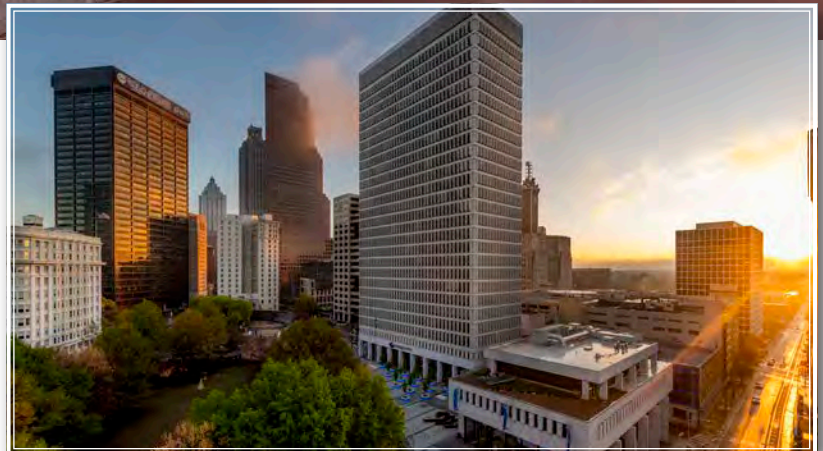

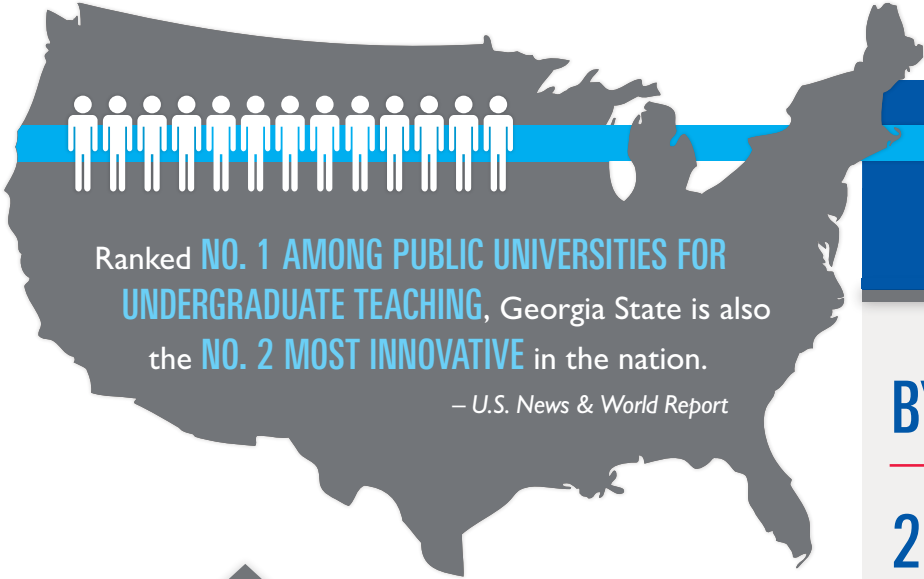

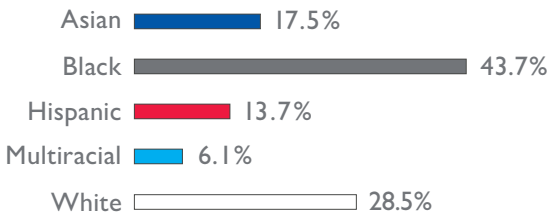

## DR. M. BRIAN BLAKE

**Named Georgia State University's eighth President in June 2021, DR. M. BRIAN BLAKE is a proven academic leader and an acclaimed engineer and computer scientist. Since arriving at Georgia State, Dr. Blake has focused his strategic visioning around central pillars.**



**H**e came to Georgia State after two years as Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at George Washington University, where he oversaw the academic mission of the institution, supporting all academic endeavors and overseeing the research enterprise across the university's 10 schools and colleges.

Prior to joining George Washington in 2019, Blake was Executive Vice President for Academics and the Nina Henderson Provost at Drexel University in Philadelphia, where he led the implementation of a new, responsibility-centered budget model and the president's strategic plan. He developed the academic vision, "Creating the 21st Century Academic Experience." During his four-year tenure, Blake helped Drexel recruit its most academically gifted class, achieve the highest retention rate in the university's history and increase

research activity to all-time high levels.

Before going to Drexel, Blake was Vice Provost for Academic Affairs and Dean of the Graduate School at the University of Miami in Miami, Fla., where he oversaw 155 programs in 12 schools and colleges. He earned a resolution of tribute from the university's Board of Trustees for elevating the visibility of graduate education and significantly enhancing the environment for faculty success.

He was an Associate Dean for Research and Professor at the College of Engineering at the University of Notre Dame where he oversaw research programs and graduate studies in the College of Engineering. During his tenure, the college had record increases in research awards and expenditures and the graduate program grew by more than 30 percent.

Prior to joining Notre Dame, Blake was on the faculty of Georgetown University

where he was Chair of the Department of Computer Science. He was Chair and Director of Graduate Studies during the inaugural years of the university's first graduate program in computer science. He also led several STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) initiatives, including a new professional master's program in technology management and collaborative efforts with the departments of Biostatistics and Radiology in the Medical School.

As a Distinguished University Professor of Systems and Software Engineering, Blake had appointments in the Department of Computer Science, Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering, and the Department of Neuroengineering.

Blake, a computer scientist and software engineer, spent six years as a software architect with Lockheed Martin, General Dynamics and The MITRE Corporation. Blake has a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Georgia Institute of Technology, a master's degree in electrical engineering from Mercer University and a Ph.D. in information and software engineering from George Mason University.

His research has received more than \$12 million in funding, and he is an author of more than 200 scholarly publications. Blake is the first Black president in the university's 114-year history.

Blake grew up in Savannah, Ga., and attended Benedictine Military Academy. He and his wife, Bridget, have two sons, Brendan and Bryce.





## CHARLIE COBB

**CHARLIE COBB enters 10th ninth year at the helm of the Georgia State Department of Athletics and 19th as a Division I athletic director, leading a transformation for the program throughout campus and the city of Atlanta.**



**T**hrough the implementation of the department's strategic plan, Cobb is focused on building a 'Culture of Success' at Georgia State based on five themes: Academic Achievement, Competitive Greatness, Ethical Behavior, Social Responsibility, and Community Engagement. Since his hire in August 2014, multiple new facilities have opened, while student-athletes continue their impressive commitment to academic performance. Georgia State has received the Sun Belt's Institutional Graduation Award twice under his tenure, and Panther student-athletes have consistently maintained a department-wide grade point average of well over 3.0, including a program-record 3.40 in spring 2020. Most recently the department achieved a 3.27 GPA for the 2022-23 academic year.

Cobb currently serves on the NCAA Division I Council and was recently a member of the College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee.

On the field, the Panthers have garnered unprecedented success during his tenure, including 2021-22, which was the best competitive season for GSU teams in school history. Georgia State led the Sun Belt Conference and finished an all-time high No. 88 in the final 2022 LEARFIELD Division I Director's Cup standings. The impressive year featured the men's basketball program's fourth NCAA berth in eight years, football's second consecutive bowl win, a top six NCAA finish for the beach volleyball program and NCAA appearances in men's soccer and tennis.

Among Cobb's biggest projects has been participating in the acquisition, purchase, and re-purposing of Turner Field, transforming the former Major

League Baseball venue into the home of Georgia State football, now named Center Parc Credit Union Stadium in recognition of the \$21 million, 15-year naming rights agreement reached in 2020. Phase One of the project was completed in August 2017 and includes new east side seating and an artificial surface field for the football team. Phase Two moved all football operations to the stadium in 2019 as part of a \$300 million plan to transform the 68-acre site.

In fall 2022, the men's and women's basketball teams began play in the new Georgia State University Convocation Center, and new baseball and softball stadiums are next within the Summerhill footprint. The GSU Soccer Complex for the men's and women's programs was completed in 2021, and the Bobby Jones Golf Practice Facility opened for the men's and women's golf teams in 2019.

Before returning to Atlanta in September 2014, Cobb spent nine years as the Director of Athletics at Appalachian State. Previously he worked for six years honing his business acumen with the Atlanta Sports Council, the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl, and the Georgia Dome, before returning to his alma mater, NC State, for 7 years.

His leadership helped build and maintain a high-performing program at App State. The Mountaineers won three consecutive Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) national championships, the first three-peat in FCS history. They also brought home eight consecutive Commissioner's Cup championships (top men's sports program in the Southern Conference) and four Germann Cup championships (top women's program). Together, they earned the men's and

women's awards in the same academic year four times.

At App State, Cobb helped create \$50 million in facilities improvements as the Mountaineers' fundraising efforts that reached all-time highs, including surpassing the \$3 million mark. The jewel of the construction projects was the seven-story Appalachian Athletics Center and the campaign also produced new homes for Mountaineer baseball, softball, and soccer, as well as a new indoor practice facility.

The 55-year-old Cobb was a four-year letterwinner as a football player at NC State. He graduated with honors with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1990 and earned a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio in 1992. As a senior center, he was named to the All-ACC second team and was an All-ACC academic selection throughout his career. He was awarded the prestigious Atlantic Coast Conference's Jim Tatum Award, which recognizes the senior football player with the highest GPA, in 1990.

Cobb and his wife, Lindsay, have a son and daughter, 25-year-old Harrison, a graduate of both Hampden-Sydney College and Ohio University, where he earned a dual Master of Business Administration and Sports Administration, and 22-year-old Branan, a Centre College graduate and current graduate student at Vanderbilt University. Lindsay Cobb was an All-ACC goalkeeper for the NC State women's soccer team from 1987-90 and is currently an assistant women's soccer coach at Emory University.

# SEASON PREVIEW

As he embarked on his seventh season as the head coach of the Georgia State Panthers, Shawn Elliott preached one message to his 2023 football team.

“From the moment we started our offseason work in January, the message was clear,” Elliott said. “We had to learn how to finish, we had to become a tougher ballclub, and we had to learn how to handle adversity. And I think we’ve made a tremendous turnaround in our mindset.”

Despite finishing 4-8 in 2022, Georgia State held second-half leads in seven of the eight losses.

The Panthers look to rebound from last year’s disappointing finish and regain what they had attained the previous three seasons and four of the last six years with winning records and bowl berths.

To do that, Georgia State will look to leaders such as quarterback Darren Grainger, tackle Travis Glover, wide receiver Robert Lewis and running back

Marcus Carroll on offense, and defensive end Javon Denis, linebackers Jontrey Hunter, Jordan Venezia and Blake Carroll, and cornerback Bryquice Brown.

The Panthers have bolstered the roster with 31 newcomers, including 18 four-year transfers, one junior college transfer and 12 freshmen.

Another new face is defensive coordinator Chad Staggs, who spent the last four seasons in the same role at Coastal Carolina.

Georgia State opens the season with back-to-back home games against Rhode Island and UConn followed by a road test at Charlotte. The Panthers open their Sun Belt gauntlet with a Thursday night contest at Coastal Carolina, followed by a home game against defending champion Troy. A trip to LSU looms on Nov. 18.

## SEASONPREVIEW

### QUARTERBACKS

**Returns:** DARREN GRAINGER (R-Sr.\*), Mikele Colasurdo (R-Jr.)

**Newcomers:** Braylen Ragland (Fr.), Bryson Harrison (Fr.)

Returning for his third season as the starter, Darren Grainger is one of the top quarterbacks in the Sun Belt Conference.

Last fall, Grainger passed for 2,443 yards and 18 touchdowns while completing 58.6 percent of his passes, ranking second in the Sun Belt and No. 10 in FBS with 14.04 yards per completion. He was also GSU's leading rusher with 734 yards (No. 9 in Sun Belt) and six touchdowns, making him third in the Sun Belt in total offense (264.8 ypg).

The super senior from Conway, S.C., ranks second in program history in TD passes (37) and TD responsibility (46), fourth in passing yards (4,158) and total offense (5,552), and seventh in rushing yards (1,394 - first among quarterbacks).

Junior backup Mikele Colasurdo also returns, and the Panthers have added a pair of talented freshmen in Braylen Ragland and Bryson Harrison.

Under head coach Shawn Elliott, Georgia State emphasizes the run, and this season should be no exception, despite the graduation of two of the top rushers in program history in Tucker Gregg and Jamyest Williams.

Marcus Carroll takes the reins this season after a strong finish to 2022, when he was third on the team and 14th in the Sun Belt with 622 yards. He made his first career start at Southern Miss and had one of the best games in program history with 163 yards rushing and three touchdowns.

Another name to watch is redshirt freshman KZ Adams. A finalist for the Mr. Football award in South Carolina as a prep senior in 2021, Adams led the nation in rushing with 3,343 yards and 42 touchdowns to lead Gray Collegiate Academy to the Class 2A state title.

Sophomore Jay Dixon also returns, and the Panthers have added depth with transfer Freddie Brock, who rushed for 1,145 yards in three seasons at Maine, and true freshman Jaylen Foster.

Lewis, now a junior, was enjoying a breakout season with six touchdown catches in the first seven games before missing four of the last five contests due to injury. He finished with 22 catches for 379 yards, averaging 17.2 yards per catch while ranking eighth in the Sun Belt in touchdowns.

Credle was second on the team with 28 receptions for 359 yards and two scores.

Junior Tailique Williams should be a key performer after contributing 10 receptions for 163 yards last season.

Adding depth are senior Cadarius Thompson, sophomore LaMarcus Brand and senior Rykem Laney, a former tight end.

The Panthers will look for contributions from a group of transfers, most notably Jacari Carter, the Merrimack transfer who earned all-conference and Freshman All-America honors at the FCS level, where he had 125 receptions for 1,227 yards and 13 touchdowns in 25 games. Also joining the program are Rico Arnold (UMass), Darius Bush (UConn) and Peter Kikwata (Old Dominion), along with freshman Quentin Thomas.

Redshirt sophomore Montavious Cunningham bookends Glover at right tackle,

with competition from junior Mason Cooks and sophomore Cameron Dye, among others.

Returns Avery Reece and Jonathan Brown are slated at center and left guard, respectively.

Among the key additions on the offensive line are transfer guards Tyden Ferris and Lamar Robinson. Ferris was the starting right guard for Central Michigan the last two seasons, blocking for 2021 FBS rushing leader Lew Nichols (1,848 yards). He is slated at right guard but could also work at center. Robinson started at tackle for Norfolk State as a freshman last fall but is working at guard.

Redshirt freshman Alec Johnson should compete for time at center. The Panthers have also added transfers Colin Henrich (South Carolina) at center and Trevor Timmons (Charlotte). Sophomore MarQuez Bargman, redshirt freshman Chauncey Kamakea, senior Ben Chukwuma and true freshman Shawn Burton Jr. add depth.

The Panthers have bolstered this area with the addition of four transfers: Henry Bryant from Louisville, Ricardo Williams Jr. from Mississippi Gulf Coast College, Anthony Blume from Norfolk State and Corey Warren from Coastal Carolina.

Veneziale, a Preseason All-Sun Belt selection, has been the Panthers' leading tackler the last two years. He ranks fifth in program history with 228 career tackles and is tied for the GSU career lead with five fumble recoveries.

Hunter is another Preseason All-Sun Belt choice who put up big numbers at OLB last season with 55 tackles, six TFL, two sacks, two interceptions--one returned for a touchdown, two forced fumbles and four pass breakups. After adding about 30 pounds and takes on a new role at inside 'backer.

Carroll has had a standout career at GSU as a two-time all-conference player who ranks in the top 10 in program history with 200 career tackles, 22 tackles for loss and nine sacks, but he is coming off a season-ending injury suffered in Game 3 last fall.

Junior Justin Abraham and sophomore Jordan Jones gained experience last season after Carroll was injured, and senior Chris Smith moved to linebacker from safety last season.

A pair of transfers can also contribute in Tavian Brown (Colorado State) and Josiah Robinson (Coastal Carolina).

## OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

# SHAWN ELLIOTT

*In his 26 seasons as a Division I coach, **SHAWN ELLIOTT** has been part of 22 **WINNING SEASONS** and 20 **postseason appearances, including four BOWL GAMES** in his six years at Georgia State.*

**N**ow in his seventh season as head coach, Shawn Elliott continues to produce firsts for the Georgia State football program.

A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by then-President Dr. Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State, where he coached the offensive line.

In 26 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 22 winning seasons, 20 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games and winning seasons in four of his six years in Atlanta, including the first three bowl victories in program history.

Other notable accomplishments in Elliott's first six seasons in Atlanta:

- GSU's first winning season as an FBS program in 2017
- School-record eight victories and the program's highest winning percentage in 2021
- First consecutive winning seasons with three straight from 2019-21
- Three straight bowl berths from 2019-21 and the first back-to-back bowl wins in 2020 & 2021

- First win over ranked opponent with 42-40 victory at No. 21 Coastal Carolina in 2021
- Stunning upset at Tennessee in 2019 for the program's first Power 5 win
- 62 All-Sun Belt Conference players
- One All-American and one Freshman All-American
- GSU's first Academic All-American® and eight Academic All-District® selections
- Program-record 3.03 GPA in his first semester
- Eleven players signed to NFL free agent contracts, including four who have played in the NFL

Not surprisingly for a long-time offensive line coach, Elliott has built the Georgia State program by establishing one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. Over the last four seasons, the Panthers have averaged 221 yards rushing per game, a figure that ranks No. 8 in the nation during that time period.

That rushing productivity was evident in 2022 as the Panthers ranked No. 14 in FBS, led by senior Tucker Gregg, who became the program's career leader with 2,265 yards.

The 2022 Panthers also ranked No. 11 in FBS with a school-record 25 turnovers forced.

Elliott's 2021 squad won seven of its last eight games to set the program record with eight victories. The Panthers achieved their third straight winning season at 8-5 while earning Georgia State's third straight bowl berth, also firsts in program history. GSU capped the season with a resounding

51-20 victory over Ball State in the TaxAct Camellia Bowl to win back-to-back bowl games for the first time.

After facing one of the toughest schedules in the Group of Five, Georgia State fought back from a 1-4 start to set the school-record for wins and establish a program record for Sun Belt Conference victories with a 6-2 mark, good for second place in the East Division.

The 2021 team achieved another milestone with the program's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent as the Panthers knocked off No. 21 Coastal Carolina 42-20 on the road.

GSU averaged 226.4 rushing yards per game to rank No. 8 in FBS, along with an aggressive defense that set school records with 38 sacks and 92 tackles for loss. Thirteen Panthers were named to the 2021 All-Sun Belt Conference team, and following the season, offensive guard Shamarius Gilmore and tight end Roger Carter, one of Elliott's first recruits, signed NFL free agent contracts.

Elliott and his staff navigated the unique challenges of 2020 to steer the Panthers to a winning season, capped by a victory in the LendingTree Bowl, marking the first back-to-back winning records and bowl berths in school history.

The 2020 Panthers featured another prolific offense that averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game and an opportunistic defense that ranked in the top 10 in the nation in sacks with 35 and turnovers forced with 21. A program-record 14 individuals

earned All-Sun Belt honors.

The 2019 season began with another major first for the Georgia State program as Elliott's Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a record-setting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1 mark.

The 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably establishing new season standards for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a then-school record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history. On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt

honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign NFL free agent contracts, is entering his sixth NFL season with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen. Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist was GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton. Hart is now with the Atlanta Falcons.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted

by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of

the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons there, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

He was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

# TRENT MCKNIGHT

## Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

*Seventh Year at GSU*

**N**ow in his seventh season at Georgia State, Trent McKnight was elevated to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2022.

In his first year in the coordinator role, the Panthers continued their prolific ground attack, ranking No. 14 in the nation in rushing. Georgia State was one on just 18 schools in the nation to average at least 200 yards of both rushing and passing.

Under McKnight's tutelage, quarterback Darren Grainger earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors while ranking second in the league in total offense and first in the Sun Belt and No. 9 nationally in yards per completion.

McKnight spent his first five seasons at Georgia State (2017-21) coaching the receivers and helping the Panthers to winning seasons and bowl berths in three straight seasons. His receiving corps were key performers in some of the most prolific offenses in program history, and he was nominated for the 2020 Broyles Award, which goes to the nation's top assistant coach.

As receivers coach, he tutored six All-Sun Belt Conference receivers and three of the top five pass catchers in program history. During that time, the Panthers set school records for scoring average (33.3 ppg in 2020), points (406 in 2019), touchdowns (53 in 2019) and total offense (439.8 ypg in 2019) while producing the top scoring averages in program history from 2019-21.

In his first two seasons at Georgia State, McKnight coached current NFL receiver Penny Hart, who ranks among the most prolific receivers in Sun Belt Conference history. In 2017, Hart led the Sun Belt with a school-record 74 receptions for 1,121 yards and eight touchdowns. Following the 2018 season, Hart earned an invitation to the Reese's Senior Bowl and signed an NFL free agent contract.

Before coming to GSU in 2017, McKnight previously coached at Samford,



where he filled several roles on the offensive staff in four seasons there while helping the program to four straight winning seasons, highlighted by a Southern Conference championship and NCAA FCS playoff berth in 2013.

He served as run game coordinator and tight ends coach for the 2015 season, when the Bulldogs ranked No. 7 in the nation in total offense (479.7 ypg) and No. 3 in passing offense while leading the SoCon in scoring with 34.6 points per game.

As Samford's passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach in 2014, McKnight tutored all-conference wide receiver Karel Hamilton, the SoCon's top pass catcher that year who went on to earn first-team All-America honors in 2016 while leading the nation with 10.1 receptions per game.

Hamilton was one of four receivers and tight ends who earned all-conference or all-freshman recognition under McKnight.

For the 2012 and 2013 seasons, McKnight

coached the Samford tight ends and inside receivers, helping the 2013 Bulldogs lead the SoCon in passing offense while ranking second in total offense and scoring en route to the conference title and playoff bid.

He returned to Samford, his alma mater, after one season (2011) as the wide receivers coach at Georgia Military College in Milledgeville.

McKnight served as a student assistant coach at Samford for the 2009 and 2010 seasons, working primarily on defense but also with running backs and special teams. He worked as a recruiting intern at Alabama (2007-08) before beginning his coaching career as an assistant at Oak Mountain High School in Birmingham (2008).

# CHAD STAGGS

## Defensive Coordinator

*First Year at GSU*

**C**had Staggs joined the Georgia State football staff as defensive coordinator in March 2023 after four seasons in the same role at Coastal Carolina.

The veteran coordinator helped the Chanticleers go 31-7 over the last three seasons and served as interim head coach for the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl.

The 2020 Broyles Award semifinalist brings coordinator experience at multiple levels of college football from stops at North Greenville (D-III), Delta State (D-II), Charleston Southern (FCS), and Furman (FCS) before joining the Coastal Carolina staff in 2019.

Staggs went to Coastal Carolina as the linebackers coach in February 2019 and was promoted to defensive coordinator in July of 2019. He also coached the inside linebackers in 2019-20 and the safeties in 2021-22.

In 2020, Staggs' defense played a pivotal role in the Chanticleers' 11-1 season, Sun Belt Conference title and national rankings that reached as high as No. 9 in the Associated Press Top 25. The CCU defense ranked No. 19 in FBS in scoring defense, No. 31 in total defense, No. 16 in pass efficiency defense and No. 9 in turnover margin.

Staggs helped mentor three All-Americans on defense in Tarron Jackson, a consensus first-team selection in 2020, as well as C.J. Brewer (2020), and Josiah Stewart (2021). Jackson, also a finalist for the Lombardi Award, the Lott IMPACT Trophy, and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft.

In 2021, Staggs' unit ranked in the Top 25 of FBS in total defense and scoring defense, led by All-American Josiah Stewart who ranked fifth in the nation with 12.5 sacks as true freshman.



Staggs went to Coastal in 2019 after two years as Furman's defensive coordinator and safeties coach from 2017-18. In 2018, he helped the Paladins earn a share of the 2018 Southern Conference championship by winning six of their final seven games.

He mentored freshman bandit Adrian Hope, who led the FCS in sacks, earned All-America honors and was a finalist for the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award, as the top freshman in FCS.

In 2017, Staggs defense led the SoCon with 34 sacks to help the Paladins to an 8-5 record, the program's first FCS playoff berth since 2013, and a consensus No. 20 final ranking in the FCS poll.

Prior to his two years at Furman, Staggs served as the defensive coordinator for four seasons at Charleston Southern, including

two seasons tutoring the linebackers and two with the defensive backs. His defenses played a major role in the Buccaneers winning 35 games, claiming two Big South Conference Championships and earning Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff berths in both 2015 and 2016.

His CSU defenses produced some impressive statistics, ranking seventh nationally in total defense in 2016 and ninth in 2015.

In Staggs' first season as defensive coordinator in 2013, the Bucs posted a 10-3 record and a No. 22 final FCS national ranking, highlighted by a 27-24 road win at Appalachian State.

Staggs served as defensive coordinator at Delta State for the 2012 season after working in the same capacity at North Greenville for three years from 2009-11. In his third season on the Crusaders' staff, he added the title of assistant head coach and was a central figure in North Greenville's run to the 2011 NCAA Division II playoff quarterfinals.

He had a brief stint at Charleston Southern in 2008, coaching the Buccaneers' secondary while also assisting with special teams.

He spent five seasons as a graduate assistant at South Carolina (2003-07) under former national championship head coaches Steve Spurrier and Lou Holtz, working with the secondary and linebackers, as well as the scout team.

Staggs began his coaching career as an assistant at Lexington (S.C.) High School from 2000-02.

He graduated from USC Upstate in 2000 with a degree in math education and also holds a master's degree in hotel, restaurant, and tourism management from the University of South Carolina.

He and his wife, Kelli, have two children, Gracie and Jack.

**Cornerbacks**

**F**ormer Georgia State defensive back Antreal Allen returned to Atlanta in 2022 on head coach Shawn Elliott's staff as the assistant secondary coach. He will work directly with the cornerbacks in 2023 after coaching the safeties in his first season.

He works with a secondary that helped the Panthers collect 13 interceptions in 2023 as part of a school-record 25 turnovers forced, which ranked No. 11 in the nation.

Allen was chosen for an NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Fellowship with the Atlanta Falcons in the summer of 2022.

Before returning to GSU, Allen spent the previous two seasons (2020-21) as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Shorter University in Rome, Ga.



He lettered four years for the Panthers, playing both cornerback and safety from 2014-17, including one season under Elliott. As a senior in 2017, Allen was the starting safety in Georgia State's first bowl victory for a Panther defense that set the GSU season record for fewest points allowed per game.

A native of Auburn, Ala., he earned his degree in computer information systems from Georgia State in 2018. He earned multiple academic honors during his time at GSU, including Dean's List, Athletic Director's Honor Roll, Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's List and Sun Belt Conference Honor Roll.

Following graduation, Allen began his coaching career with two seasons on Elliott's staff in a quality control position in 2018 and then a graduate assistant role on the 2019 bowl team before moving to Shorter for the 2020 season.

**A**rketa Banks joined the Georgia State football staff as the special teams coordinator for head coach Shawn Elliott in May 2022.

Banks came to GSU after one season at Elon, his alma mater, where he coached tight ends (2021) and cornerbacks (spring 2022).

Before going to Elon, Banks served two tours at Western Carolina. In three seasons from 2017-19, he worked with wide receivers, running backs and tight ends. In his first stint in Cullowee, he tutored the running backs from 2009-12.

In between, Banks coached at NCAA Division II powerhouse Lenoir-Rhyne for five seasons from 2013-17, serving as the slotbacks coach in 2013-2014 and wide receivers' coach from 2015-17. During the 2014 season, he coached the slotbacks D-II national-record 416.2 rushing yards per game, led by NCAA Division II All-America Chris Robinson. The Bears went 11-1 in 2014 and finished the season ranked No. 8 in the nation.



While at Lenoir-Rhyne, Banks also served as the Director of High School Relations and In-State Recruiting.

He moved to Gardner-Webb in 2018 and coached the running backs and tight ends for one season before returning to Western Carolina in 2019.

Banks got his start in coaching at his alma mater, Warren County High School in Warrenton, N.C., first as the junior varsity head coach in 2004 before taking over at the varsity level in 2005. He also coached prep football at Wakefield High in Raleigh in 2006-07, coaching defensive backs and quarterbacks.

He earned his first collegiate coaching position at Brevard College in 2008, where he coached the defensive secondary and served as the program's recruiting coordinator for one season.

A 2003 graduate of Elon, Banks was a four-year letterwinner and an All-Big South Conference performer as a receiver and a kick returner in 2002. He was also named All-Independent as a return specialist in 2001. During his career, he led Elon in receiving from 2000-2002, amassing 1,371 yards on 54 catches with 17 receiving touchdowns.

Banks and his wife, the former Latora Pettaway of Henderson, N.C., have three children; Shymia, Kimora, and Arketa II.

**Q**uinshad Davis joined the Panthers' staff as wide receivers coach in March 2022, coming to Georgia State after two years at USF.

In his first season with the Panthers, he coached Jamari Thrash, who led the Sun Belt Conference with 1,122 receiving yards while earned all-conference and All-America honors. Robert Lewis also enjoyed a breakout season with six touchdown catches in just eight games.

While at USF, Davis served as a quality control analyst, working with the wide receivers in 2020 and then with running backs and tight ends in 2021.

Davis was a standout receiver at North Carolina, where he earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors and finished his career as the Tar Heels' all-time leader in



receptions (205) and touchdown catches (25).

# DAN ELLINGTON

## Tight Ends

*Fourth Year at GSU*

**F**ormer Georgia State quarterback Dan Ellington enters his fourth season on the GSU staff and his second as the tight ends coach after two years with the running backs.

In his first two seasons on the staff, Ellington coached three All-Sun Belt Conference running backs who each gained over 750 yards.

In 2021, his All-Sun Belt backs Tucker Gregg and Jamyest Williams combined for more than 1,800 yards rushing as the Panthers ranked No. 8 in FBS in rushing with 226.4 yards per game, the second best figure in program history. Gregg (953 yards) and Williams (859) produced GSU's second and third-highest season totals, and Williams set a school record with 6.7 yards per carry.

In 2020, Ellington was part of an offensive staff that led Georgia State to a school-record scoring average of 33.3



points, along with nearly 200 rushing yards per game.

As a player and then coach, Ellington helped Georgia State to three straight winning seasons from 2019-21, including a school-record eight victories in 2021, and three straight bowl games.

After completing his standout playing career as the Panthers' starting quarterback in 2018-19, he was named to the coaching staff in May 2020.

A two-time All-Sun Belt Conference selection as a dual-threat quarterback, Ellington achieved numerous records and milestones. He finished with the highest career completion percentage in GSU history (62.0 percent) while ranking second with 34 touchdowns passes. He ranks third in every other career passing category, including 4,566 yards passing on 401 completions with just 13 interceptions. He also finished fourth on the GSU career rushing list with 1,293 yards and 11 touchdowns.

As a senior in 2019, he passed for 2,447 yards and 22 touchdowns and rushed for 668 yards and six scores to lead the GSU to seven victories and a bowl berth. He authored one of the signature moments in Georgia State sports history when he led the Panthers to their season-opening 38-30 victory at Tennessee.

Beyond the statistics, Ellington was a tremendous leader who displayed remarkable selflessness and grit in playing the final four games of his senior season with a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee.

A native of Olive Branch, Miss., Ellington starred at Center Hill High School and then was an NJCAA All-American at Itawamba (Miss.) Community College before coming to Georgia State.

He earned his degree in education from Georgia State in 2020.

# JOHN HOLT

## Offensive Line

*Second Year at GSU*

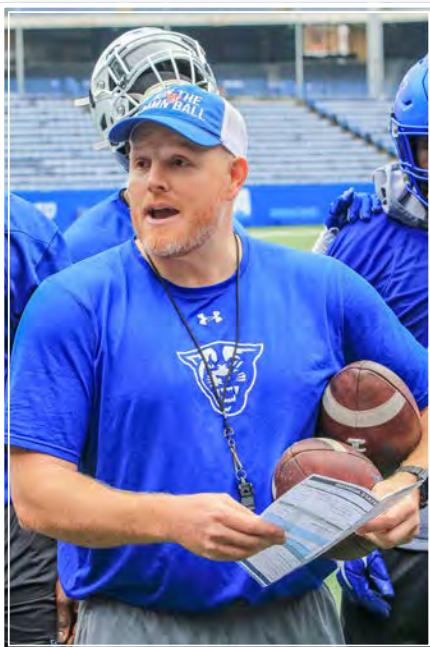

**J**ohn Holt is in his second season as offensive line coach after joining the Georgia State staff in 2022.

In his first season with the Panthers, his unit helped Georgia State rank No. 14 in the nation in rushing while averaging over 200 yards of both rushing and passing. Two of Holt's offensive linemen, center Malik Sumter and guard Pat Bartlett, earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors.

Before coming to GSU, Holt spent the 2021 season as the offensive coordinator at Dodge City (Kan.) Community College after nine seasons at Western Carolina, where he served as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. He previously played and coached under Shawn Elliott at Appalachian State.

Holt originally joined the Western Carolina staff as offensive line coach in 2012. During his time in Cullowhee, he tutored seven All-Southern Conference offensive linemen, three So-Con All-Freshman honorees and two



Freshman All-America linemen. His offensive line paved the way for four consecutive 1,000-yard rushers from 2015-18.

He was elevated to associate head coach and co-offensive coordinator in 2019 and then to offensive coordinator for the 2020-21 spring season.

Holt began his coaching career in 2008 in an offensive quality control position at App State, working under Elliott, then the Mountaineers' offensive line coach. Holt then served as App State's tight ends coach from 2009-11, coaching four-time all-conference tight end Ben Jorden in three of his four seasons.

A native of Leicester, N.C., and a 2008 graduate of Appalachian State, Holt was a four-year letterman, helping the Mountaineers to three straight NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07. As a senior, he served as team captain while earning third team All-America honors from The Sports Network.

He and his wife Krystle have one son, John Thomas, who goes by JT, and one daughter, Grace.

# BRIAN LANDIS

## Inside Linebackers

*Fourth Year at GSU*

**B**rian Landis is in his fourth season on the Georgia State staff as the inside linebackers coach.

In his first three years in Atlanta, he has coached four all-conference honorees while helping the Panthers to back-to-back bowl wins in 2020 and 2021.

He joined the GSU staff in February 2020 after three seasons as the head coach at Frederick Douglass High School in Lexington, Ky. In addition, he previously served on the coaching staffs at Kentucky, Eastern Kentucky and Georgetown (Ky.) College.

Last fall, inside linebacker Jordan Venezia ranked No. 3 in the nation with three fumble recoveries, part of a GSU defense that forced a school-record 25 turnovers to rank No. 11 in FBS.

In 2021, both of his starting inside linebackers, Venezia and Blake Carroll, earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors. That duo helped GSU set school records with 38 sacks and 92 tackles for loss while holding opponents to 141.4 rushing yards per game, the third-lowest mark in school history.

In 2020 in his first season in Atlanta, Landis helped coach a Georgia State defense that ranked in the Top 10 in FBS in sacks (No. 7 with

a school-record 35) and turnovers forced (No. 8 with 21) while allowing a program-record 3.86 yards per rush. The Panthers' average of 136.6 rushing yards allowed per game was the second-best mark in school history.

Both starting inside linebackers earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors as Carroll enjoyed a breakout season and senior Trajan Stephens-McQueen finished among the top tacklers in program history.

Landis compiled a 35-5 record at Frederick Douglass after starting the program from scratch in 2017 at the newly-opened school. In 2019, he led the Broncos to a 14-1 record and a berth in the Class 5A state finals.

His first team posted a 10-3 record and reached the 2017 state quarterfinals, and in 2018, Frederick Douglass went 11-1 and earned a No. 1 ranking in 6A.

Landis went to Frederick Douglass after one season (2016) at Kentucky as a defensive quality control coach working with linebackers, and one year (2015) as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Kentucky.

He spent a total of 12 seasons (2001, 2004-14) coaching at Georgetown, his alma mater, where he was part of NAIA national championships as a player (2000) and coach

(2001).

Landis coached the Georgetown defensive backs from 2006-14 and also served as the Tigers' recruiting coordinator from 2010-14. During that time, he helped Georgetown to four conference titles and NAIA playoff appearances, including a No. 1 national ranking during the 2012 season.

Landis enjoyed a standout playing career at Georgetown, culminating with a senior season in which he captained the Tigers' to the 2000 NAIA title team and was named the Defensive Player of the Game for the championship. The following year he served as a graduate assistant coach as Georgetown won its second straight NAIA championship.

He had a brief professional career in arena football before returning to Georgetown as assistant linebackers and special teams coach in 2004, when the Tigers reached the NAIA national semifinals.

Landis graduated from Georgetown in 2001 with a B.S. degree in business administration, and he completed his master's in special education in 2006.

A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, Landis and his wife Ashley have two sons, Park, 13, and Jack, 11.

# CORY PEOPLES

**Defensive Passing Game Coordinator/Secondary**

**N**ow in his fourth season on the Georgia State staff, Cory Peoples serves as the secondary coach and defensive passing game coordinator. In 2023, in addition to overseeing the defensive backfield, he will work directly with the safeties after working primarily with the cornerbacks his first three years.

Peoples has helped coach a Georgia State defense that ranks among the national for sacks, tackles for loss and turnovers forced over the last two seasons. In addition to helping lead the Panthers to back-to-back bowl victories, he has tutored two-time All-Sun Belt Conference cornerback Quavian White, who ranks second in school history in interceptions.

In 2021, the Panthers held five teams to one offensive touchdown and set school records with 38 sacks and 92 tackles for loss while forcing 21 turnovers, including 11 interceptions. In 2020 in Peoples' first season in Atlanta, the Georgia State defense also forced 21 turnovers (in just 10 games) with

10 interceptions.

A former NFL player with more than 10 years of college coaching experience, Peoples came to the Panther program in February 2020 after one season (2018) as the cornerbacks coach at Georgia Southern, where he coached a pair of two-time All-Sun Belt selections.

Peoples is a three-time recipient of the NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship, working with the Philadelphia Eagles (2012) and the Kansas City Chiefs (2015-16).

In 2017, Peoples served as the defensive coordinator at Albany State, where three of his players earned all-conference honors as the Golden Rams allowed fewer than 290 yards of total offense per game.

He also spent one season (2016) coaching the defensive backs at South Carolina State, including two all-conference safeties.

Peoples coached defensive backs at Charleston Southern for two seasons (2014-15), and in his final year there, he helped



coach a Buccaneers' squad that ranked No. 9 in the nation in total defense and No. 4 in passing yards allowed en route to a berth in the FCS playoffs. He had two all-conference defensive backs in both years, including the Big South's career leader in pass breakups.

His other college coaching stops include St. Augustine (2013), Clark Atlanta (2009-12) and Georgia Military College (2008). He began his coaching career in 2007 as an assistant at W.J. Keenan High School in Columbia, S.C.

Peoples spent two years (2005-06) on the Philadelphia Eagles' roster and played one season each with the Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe and the Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League.

A native of Bishopville, S.C., Peoples was an all-state quarterback and defensive back at Bishopville High School. He attended Georgia Military College, where he won the NJCAA National Championship in 2001, and then lettered two years in the secondary at South Carolina.

Peoples earned his bachelor's degree in retail management from South Carolina in 2005. He is married to the former Keilah Speed and the couple has two sons, Cory Jr. and Lucas, and a daughter, Isabella.

## Defensive Line

**A**llen Smith enters his second season on the Georgia State staff as defensive line coach. He came to GSU in 2022 after one season in the National Football League as assistant defensive line coach for the Houston Texans.

In his first season at GSU, Smith coached All-Sun Belt Conference defensive end Javon Denis. He was part of a GSU defensive staff that helped the Panthers rank No. 11 in FBS in turnovers forced with 25, a school record.

Before his NFL stint, he spent three years as defensive line coach at Wofford, helping the Terriers to back-to-back berths in the NCAA FCS playoffs in 2018 and 2019.

In both of those seasons, Smith helped coach the top defense in the Southern Conference. In 2018, the Terriers led the conference in rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense, ranking No. 12 or higher in FCS in all three categories.

The following year, Wofford again led the league in total defense as well as sacks, while ranking second in rushing and scoring defense.

Smith developed and coached All-America and All-Southern Conference nose



tackle Miles Brown, who signed a free agent contract with the Arizona Cardinals and appeared in nine games in 2019 and then spent time on the Tennessee Titans practice squad in 2020.

Smith served one season as the defensive line coach at VMI (2017) and one season at Duke as a defensive operations assistant (2016). In 2015, as a defensive graduate assistant at Appalachian State, he worked with Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year Ronald Blair, who was a fifth-round draft pick by the San Francisco 49ers in 2016.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Calhoun County High School in 2014.

As a player, Smith was a standout defensive lineman at Wofford who helped the Terriers to four straight NCAA FCS playoff berths, including SoCon titles in 2010 and 2012. He served as team captain as a senior.

Smith earned his bachelor's degree in business economics from Wofford in 2012. He and his wife Joy have two daughters, Harleigh, born in 2020, and Emori, born in 2023.

The native of Canton, Ga., earned her bachelor's degree from West Georgia in 2019 in health and community wellness.

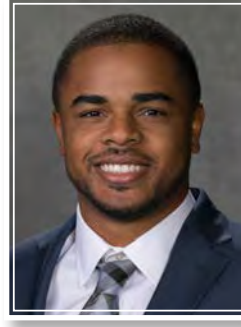


### CHANTEL AUDAINE

**SOUTH CAROLINA 35, GEORGIA STATE 14**

Game 1: Sept. 3, 2022 • 7:30 p.m. (ESPN+/SECN+) Williams-Brice Stadium • Columbia, S.C.

Georgia State fell in its season opener at South Carolina, 35-14, at Williams-Brice Stadium.

GSU rushed for 200 yards, including 76 yards by Jamyest Williams, and cornerback Quavian White led the defense with two interceptions, but the Panthers hurt themselves with special teams miscues, including two blocked punts returned for touchdowns.

"I thought offensively and defensively, we went toe to toe with them, but we can't have those special teams mistakes. It's unacceptable," said head coach Shawn Elliott, who grew up near Columbia and spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at South Carolina, serving as the interim head coach in 2015 following Steve Spurrier's retirement.

"We went out there and moved the ball, and we made plays defensively. I thought our guys busted their tails and fought hard, like I knew we would."

Georgia State outgained the Gamecocks 311 yards to 306. The GSU defense held South Carolina to 79 yards rushing on 32 carries, the fourth straight opponent that the Panthers have held below 100 yards rushing.

Trailing just 12-7 at the half, White, the Greer, S.C., native, intercepted South Carolina quarterback Spencer Rattler on the second play of the third quarter to give the Panthers possession at the USC 32.

Williams, who transferred from South Carolina, gained 20 yards on a short pass to the 12. Quarterback Darren Grainger converted on third down with a 7-yard run to the 2-yard line and scored two plays later on a 4-yard run around the right side to give Georgia State a 14-12 lead with 11:43 remaining in the third quarter.

South Carolina answered with a touchdown to regain the lead at 20-14 with seven minutes to play in the third quarter before the two blocked punts led to the final margin.

White intercepted Rattler again late in the third

quarter, giving him nine career interceptions to equal teammate Antavious Lane for the GSU career lead.

Down 9-0, Georgia State got on the board late in the second quarter with a 6-play, 75-yard drive on which Grainger had two huge completions. He opened the march by finding Jamari Thrash down the right sideline for 28 yards, and he capped the drive with a 17-yard touchdown strike over the middle to Robert Lewis to pull GSU within 9-7.

South Carolina managed a late field goal to take a 12-7 lead into the locker room.

**NORTH CAROLINA 35, GEORGIA STATE 28**

Georgia State scored 25 straight points in the second and third quarters to take a 28-21 lead on North Carolina, but the Tar Heels managed a 35-28 victory at Center Parc Stadium.

With GSU hosting a Power 5 opponent for the first time, sophomore wide receiver Robert Lewis caught two touchdowns for the Panthers (0-2) and recorded career highs with seven receptions for 115 yards, while Jacorey Crawford and Jontrey Hunter led a GSU defense that forced three turnovers.

"I never, ever question what we do as a football team as far as effort," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Some of our execution could have been better, but man, what a team that we have. The way we played against the University of South Carolina and the University of North Carolina, we're going to hold our heads high and come back next week as a better football team."

"We had the opportunity to take that game, but we didn't make the plays that we needed to. Some critical plays, both offensively and defensively and on special teams. It was certainly a team loss. We made plays, but didn't make enough of those plays."

Trailing 21-3, Georgia State got in the end zone with five minutes left in the first half as Darren Grainger found Kris Byrd for a 6-yard scoring pass and the first career touchdown for the sophomore tight end to pull within 21-10 at the half.

The Panthers took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 75 yards, capped by Grainger's 49-yard touchdown pass to Lewis, bringing GSU within 21-17.

On the next play, Crawford intercepted UNC (3-0) quarterback Drake Maye at the GSU 43, setting up Michael Hayes' 45-yard field goal, and the Panthers were within 21-20 with 10 minutes to play in the third quarter.

Crawford came up with another turnover on the Tar Heels' next possession, recovering a fumble at the GSU 26, but the Panthers could not convert. However, the GSU defense got a third-down sack from Javon Denis for a three-and-out.

After the punt, Georgia State was pinned at the 2-yard line, but the Panthers drove 98 yards on 10

plays, capped by Grainger's 29-yard TD to Lewis. Grainger then hit Jamari Thrash for the 2-point conversion, and Georgia State led 28-21 with two minutes left in the third quarter.

Lewis, the sophomore from Covington, Ga., has now caught four touchdown passes in the last three games.

But UNC managed back-to-back touchdowns, regaining the lead on Omarion Hampton's 2-yard run with 10:42 to play.

Georgia State put up 421 yards of offense with 235 yards rushing and 186 yards passing. Grainger finished 16-for-24 with three touchdowns and rushed for 75 yards. Tucker Gregg led the Panthers with 79 yards on the ground.

## CHARLOTTE 42, GEORGIA STATE 41

Game 3: Sept. 17, 2022 • 7 p.m. (ESPN+)

Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State rallied to take the lead on Darren Grainger's 32-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash with 1:39 left, but Charlotte scored with just 17 seconds to come away with a 42-41 win at Center Parc Stadium.

Chris Reynolds' 2-yard scoring pass to Grant DuBose for the winning score spoiled prolific nights by Grainger, who passed for a career-high 343 yards, and Thrash, who broke the Georgia State single-game receiving yardage record with 213 yards on 10 catches. The previous high was 191 yards by Penny Hart in 2017.

Georgia State (0-3) piled up 602 yards of offense, the fourth-highest figure in program history, as Grainger completed 22 of 34 passes with four touchdowns while the Panthers rushed for 259 yards, including an even 100 by Tucker Gregg, 94 by Marcus Carroll and 54 by Grainger. Sophomore tight end Kris Byrd caught two touchdown passes.

But the Panthers had trouble stopping Charlotte (1-3), which gained 501 yards, including 401 through the air as Reynolds was 31-for-43 for 401 yards and five touchdowns.

Trailing 35-33, GSU took over at its own 26 with 4:21 to play. Four straight runs by Carroll moved the ball out to the GSU 49, and then Gregg rushed three times to give the Panthers a first down at the Charlotte 32, setting up Grainger's TD pass to Thrash. Grainger then rushed for the two-point conversion to give the Panthers a 41-35 lead with 1:33 left.

Reynolds moved Charlotte into the red zone, and then a pass interference penalty in the end zone gave the 49ers a first-and-goal at the 2. On third-and-three, Reynolds found DuBose over the middle for the go-ahead score.

"It was a poorly executed football game, starting with me," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It starts with myself and it goes down to our assistant coaches, to our captains and our seniors and to everyone in that locker room. Offensively, defensively and special teams. It's 42-41 and we missed an extra point, gave up a sack fumble and gave up 500 yards of offense. We didn't execute at all today."

Georgia State started fast with a touchdown on the opening possession, driving 75 yards in 11 plays, capped by Grainger's 9-yard TD pass to Byrd.

The Panthers also scored on their second possession as Grainger connected with Robert Lewis for a 49-yard scoring play to take a 14-7 lead with 6:21 left in the first quarter. That was Lewis' fourth TD catch of the season and fifth over the last four games.

Charlotte moved ahead 21-14 with back-to-back touchdowns, including a sack-fumble returned for a score. Georgia State answered with Tucker Gregg's 2-yard touchdown run, but a missed extra point left the Panthers trailing 21-20 midway through the second quarter.

Gregg's TD was set up by a 73-yard pass to Thrash for Grainger's longest completion in a Panther uniform and the longest pass for any GSU quarterback since 2016 (Conner Manning to Glenn Smith for 78 yards).

Super senior cornerback Quavian White grabbed his 10th career interception to take sole possession of the Georgia State career lead, moving ahead of junior safety Antavious Lane (9).

Tucker Gregg and Jamyest Williams each rushed for over 100 yards, and the Georgia State defense came up with a huge goal-line stand in the fourth quarter to lead the Panthers to a 31-14 victory at Army Saturday afternoon at Michie Stadium.

With the Panthers holding a 17-14 lead in the fourth quarter, Georgia State (1-4) stopped Army (1-3) on fourth down inside the 1-yard line to preserve the lead with nine minutes to play and then stopped Army one more time on fourth down with three minutes left.

The GSU offense took over at midfield, needing one first down to seal the win, and on 3rd-and-5 at the GSU 43, quarterback Darren Grainger connected with Ja'Cyais Credle down the right sideline for a 57-yard touchdown and a 24-14 lead with 2:59 left.

"It was a great way to win," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We faced some adversity in the second half and we had to dig down and find out what we're made of to make a stop. They had about six inches to go for that touchdown. Then to see us finish the game offensively the way we did, it was a great way to finish."

"We still have a long way to go, but what you saw out there today was what I had envisioned for our first four contests."

Gregg put the exclamation point on the victory with a 56-yard touchdown run with 55 seconds left. Not only did that run give him 124 yards for his fifth career 100-yard game, but it was his 20th career rushing touchdown to give him sole possession of the Georgia State record.

Williams had 106 yards rushing, including a 33-yard TD run in the second quarter that put the Panthers up 17-0. Grainger rushed for 48 yards with a 13-yard touchdown, and Marcus Carroll added 28 yards as Georgia State put up 299 yards on the ground.

Grainger threw just 12 times, completing eight for 157 yards and one touchdown.

Leading the Georgia State defense was inside linebacker Jordan Venezia, who had a career-high 13 tackles, two fumble recoveries and two pass breakups. Redshirt freshman linebacker Jordan Jones, making his first start in place of injured star Blake Carroll, made 12 tackles.

The Panthers shut out Army in the first half, but then had to hold on as the Black Knights got their running game going in the second half. On the fourth down play at the goal line, a host of tacklers led by Shamar McCollum stuffed Army's 260-pound

Coastal Carolina (4-0) got off to a hot start with a pair of quick touchdowns to take a 14-0 lead just three minutes into the game before Georgia State got on the board with an 87-yard touchdown drive. Tucker Gregg scored on a 4-yard run for his 19th career rushing touchdown to tie the GSU record set by Tra Barnett (2016-19). That pulled the Panthers within 14-7 with midway through the first quarter.

Late in the first half, Robert Lewis hauled in a 29-yard touchdown pass to bring the Panthers within 27-17 with 44 seconds left in the first half. The sophomore receiver has caught a TD pass in five straight games, including two against North Carolina for six scores in his last five contests.

Georgia State opened the second half with the ball, but a promising drive ended with an interception and the Coastal 16, and the Chanticleers converted the turnover into a long touchdown drive for a 14-point swing and a 34-17 lead.

That remained the score until Hunter grabbed his first career interception and raced for the end zone, pulling the Panthers within 34-24 with 7:28 to play. But Coastal sealed the win with a touchdown drive.

"I credit Coastal Carolina. They've got a good football team, and they play extremely hard," Elliott said. "You just can't make the mistakes that we made."

"It was a very disappointing night. We were short-handed a little bit, but there are capable players to go out there and play. A couple of missed assignments right from the get-go just got us behind very very quickly."

After losing top LB Blake Carroll to a season-ending injury, the Panthers also played without their top three offensive tackles.

Once the defense came up with those two fourth-down stops, the offense sealed it with the gutsy call that resulted in the Credle's 57-yard touchdown catch.

"The call was win the game," Elliott said. "He said, if the shot is there, do you want to take it, and I said, Yes sir, we're taking it.

"It was so nice to see that ball go up in the air and land in those hands and run into the end zone."

Georgia State piled up 335 yards rushing, including 100-yard games by Jamyest Williams and Tucker Gregg, and the GSU defense forced a school-record five turnovers as the Panthers defeated Georgia Southern for the third straight year with a 41-33 victory at Center Parc Stadium.

Georgia State (2-4, 1-1 Sun Belt) improved to 6-3 in the all-time series against Georgia Southern (3-3, 0-2).

Williams and Gregg each topped the 100-yard mark for the second straight game, combining for 240 yards and three touchdowns. Williams finished with a career-high 129 yards, including a 6-yard touchdown run, while Gregg had 111 yards and two scores, topping the 2,000-yard mark for his career. The senior from Chatsworth, Ga., now has 2,020 career yards, 136 yards behind Tra Barnett's GSU record of 2,156.

Quarterback Darren Grainger added 70 yards rushing while passing for 186 yards and two touchdowns.

Georgia State tied its school record with four interceptions as Quavian White, Jamil Muhammad, Jontrey Hunter and Jordan Jones came up with picks. Hunter also caused a late fumble that was recovered by Jordan Veneziale, who has three fumble recoveries in the last two games. The four interceptions and five turnovers forced equal the school records set vs. South Alabama in 2011.

"This game means a lot," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It was a great football game. There were times when I thought we were going to pull away, but credit to that football team and their coaching staff. They kept fighting back, and we had to go out there and win it."

The Panthers took the lead for good on a pair of Michael Hayes field goals in the first quarter to go up 13-7 with a minute left in the period.

In the second quarter, Williams, the senior from Athens, Ga., gained every yard on a 6-play, 75-yard

scoring drive. He started the march with a 42-yard run and finished it with a 6-yard touchdown for a 20-10 lead with 10 minutes left in the first half.

Hunter's interception at the GSU 21-yard line set up another quick scoring drive as Grainger hit Tailique Williams for 16 yards and then connected with Jamari Thrash for a 53-yard scoring play and a 27-10 lead.

Georgia State entered the third quarter with a 27-17 lead and marched down the field on its opening possession, capped by Gregg's 3-yard touchdown. That put the Panthers up 34-17 five minutes into the third quarter.

Georgia Southern managed a pair of touchdowns, but Justin Abraham blocked an extra point for the Panthers to keep Georgia State's lead at 34-30 with two minutes left in the third quarter.

Then the Panthers answered with a 9-play, 75-yard scoring drive as Gregg broke through the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run, extending the lead to 41-30 with 13 minutes to play.

After holding Georgia Southern to a field goal, the GSU defense came up with a pair of huge turnovers late in the game. Jones intercepted Georgia Southern quarterback Kyle Vantrease at midfield with five minutes left, and after a Georgia State punt, Hunter punched the ball away from Khaleb Hood, and Veneziale recovered at the Georgia Southern 34.

After three runs by Gregg netted nine yards, the Panthers went for it on fourth down and sealed the win with Gregg's 3-yard run for first down.

"That last fourth-down play, when you gotta get the first down, there was really no question what we were going to do. I thought we controlled the line of scrimmage all day," said Elliott, whose squad has rushed for 534 yards over the last two games.

"It feels very good to have two wins in a row, from where we started. I'm very proud of our football team."

Playing a Wednesday night Sun Belt Conference game at Appalachian State, Georgia State fell 42-17 to the Mountaineers at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Running back Tucker Gregg rushed 93 yards and a touchdown and quarterback Darren Grainger added 92 yards and a score to lead the Panthers (2-5, 1-2 Sun Belt). Georgia State rushed for 228 yards, but turned the ball over four times and struggled in the passing game as Grainger was 7-for-23 for 73 yards.

Gregg's 93 yards moved him closer to the Georgia State career rushing record. The super senior from Chatsworth, Ga., now has 2,113 yards, just 43 yards behind Tra Barnett's school record of 2,156 yards. Gregg also scored his 23rd career rushing touchdown, adding to his GSU record.

Georgia State started fast, scoring touchdowns on its first two possessions. First the Panthers drove 79 yards on 11 plays, capped by Gregg's 4-yard touchdown. After forcing App State to punt, Georgia State extended its lead to 14-0 on Grainger's 26-yard scoring run with four minutes left in the first quarter.

On that run, the GSU quarterback topped the 1,00-yard rushing mark for his Georgia State career.

App State scored late in the first half, and Georgia State took a 14-7 lead into the intermission.

The Panthers opened the second half with the ball and quickly moved down the field for a first down at the App 34. But a penalty on first down led to a sack and fumble on third down, and App State (4-3, 2-2 Sun Belt) converted the turnover into the tying touchdown.

"The opening drive of the second half was really critical," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We came out and got a big run. You've got first-and-10 and you get a false start penalty. Now it's first-and-15 and that leads to the doggone fumble, and then they take advantage of it."

"I try to tell these guys, you can't give a good football team hope. We had them at that particular point, but we gave them momentum and they took advantage of it.

"We played hard, and we played with great effort. We just couldn't hold up."

App State forced a punt on the Panthers' next possession and drove for the go ahead touchdown, moving ahead 21-14 with four minutes left in the third quarter on a 1-yard scoring run by quarterback Chase Brice. An interception deep in Georgia State territory led to another App touchdown and a 28-14 lead late in the third quarter.

In his first game back from injury, running back Camerun Peoples rushed for 168 yards to lead App State.

Tucker Gregg rushed for 52 of Georgia State's 218 yards to become the program's all-time leading rusher as the Panthers earned a 31-17 victory over Old Dominion on Homecoming at Center Parc Stadium.

Quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 195 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 104 yards and another score, and the Georgia State (3-5, 2-2 Sun Belt) defense collected six sacks, forced two turnovers and held the Monarchs (3-5, 2-2) to 26 yards rushing and 283 total yards. The 26 yards rushing is the third-lowest total allowed by GSU in program history.

Gregg, the super senior and former walk-on from Chatsworth, Ga., now has 2,165 career yards as he moved past Tra Barnett, who had 2,156 yards from 2016-19. He scored his 24th career rushing touchdown on a 4-yard run in the first quarter.

"He's just a tremendous young man, and I'm very very proud of him for setting this record," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "This is a young man who walked on. He didn't have any offers coming out of high school, so he recruited us. It was very evident that what brought here was a determination, a leadership mentality and work ethic that you don't see a lot of in this day and age."

After a 14-14 first half, the Georgia State defense forced ODU to go three-and-out on its opening possession, and then the Panthers went on a 17-play, 80-yard drive that chewed up eight minutes as Grainger's 1-yard scoring run put GSU up 21-14. Every play on the drive but one was a run as Gregg, Grainger, Jamyest Williams and Marcus Carroll all carried the ball.

Old Dominion's next possession was also three-and-out, but this time Thomas Gore sacked quarterback Hayden Wolf on third down and forced a fumble that Javon Denis recovered at the ODU 11-yard line. One play later, Carroll scampered around the right end for an 11-yard touchdown and a 28-14 GSU lead with four minutes left in the third quarter.

After another ODU punt, the GSU offense ground out another long drive, this time eating up more than 10 minutes on 18 plays to set up Michael Hayes' 26-yard field goal to put the Panthers up 31-14 with six minutes left in the game.

Old Dominion managed a field goal to cut the lead to 31-17, but Georgia State recovered the onside kick with 4:50 left. The Monarchs had one final possession that GSU linebacker Justin Abraham ended with an interception to seal the win.

Grainger completed 14-of-20 passes, including a 38-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash. The Panthers recorded 413 yards of total offense, including 218 yards on the ground, topping 200 yard rushing for the 14th time in the last 16 games.

Thomas Gore (2), Jeffery Clark (1.5), Jontrey Hunter (1), Shamar McCollum (1) and Javon Denis (0.5) collected the Panthers six sacks, one shy of the school record.

ODU receiver Ali Jennings entered the game as the nation's leader in receiving yards, but the Panthers limited him to three catches for 24 yards.

Gore had two of the Panthers' six sacks on the day. On one of those sacks, he caused a fumble that GSU recovered at the ODU 11-yard line. One play later, the Panthers scored to take a 28-14 lead in the third quarter.

Junior Marcus Carroll rushed for a career-high 163 yards and tied the school record with three rushing touchdowns and the Georgia State defense set a school record by holding Southern Miss to just 202 total yards in the Panthers' 42-14 at M.M. Roberts Stadium.

GSU won for the fourth time in the last five games and snapped the Golden Eagles' three-game winning streak.

GSU (4-5, 3-2 Sun Belt) quarterback Darren Grainger joined Carroll in the 100-yard column with a career-high 143 yards on the ground, along with 143 yards and two touchdowns passing. Grainger topped the 100-yard mark for the second straight game, and gave the Panthers two 100-yard rushers in the game for the third time in the last five contests.

But the story was the GSU defense, which tied the school record with seven sacks against three different Southern Miss (5-4, 3-2) quarterbacks. Jeffery Clark led the way with two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss, while Javon Denis had seven tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss with 1.5 sacks. GSU held the Eagles to 33 net yards rushing, the fourth-lowest total in program history.

Combined with last week's win over Old Dominion, which managed 26 yards rushing and 283 total yards, the Georgia State defense has allowed just 485 yards of offense, including only 59 yards rushing, over the last two games.

"What a great game! That might be one of the best performances I've seen us have in all three phases," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Both sides of the football were dominant, and our special teams did a nice job all night. It's just nice to see us play another 60-minute ballgame. We didn't let up."

"Defensively, it looked like on every play we were in the backfield. They're quarterbacks could never get comfortable."

Behind Grainger and Carroll, Georgia State rushed for 388 yards, the third-highest single-game total in program history. Carroll was making his first career start due to injuries to Jamyest Williams (DNP) and Tucker Gregg (limited play today).

Georgia State led 28-0 at the intermission after outgaining the Eagles 310 yards to 76 in the first half. The GSU defense allowed just 10 yards on 12 plays in the first quarter.

Southern Miss managed two quick touchdowns to cut the lead to 28-14 midway through the third quarter. But on Georgia State's next offensive snap, Grainger rushed 60 yards down to the USM 15-yard line. Three plays later, Carroll scored his third touchdown of the day on a 1-yard run, and the Panthers led 35-14 with 2:25 to play in the third quarter. Then the GSU defense forced a three-and-out, and the Eagles never threatened again.

On its second possession of the game, Georgia State drove 80 yards for a touchdown, grinding out 15 plays and eating up 5:41 on the clock for Grainger's 6-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash and a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

Thrash also caught a 30-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter.

Already playing without All-Sun Belt defenders Blake Carroll, the inside linebacker who was lost for the season, and cornerback Quavian White, who missed today's game due to injury, the Panthers' then lost their other starting cornerback, Bryquice Brown, late in the first half, but the defense didn't miss a beat.

## ULM 31, GEORGIA STATE 28

**Game 10: Nov. 12, 2022 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+)**  
**Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.**

Georgia State fell 31-28 to ULM Saturday afternoon at Center Parc Stadium, snapping the Panthers' two-game winning streak. GSU led the entire game until the Warhawks' Quae Drake returned an interception 10 yards for a touchdown with 6:23 remaining.

Playing without three injured starters on offense, including two starting offensive linemen, and two starters on defense, Georgia State (4-6, 3-3 Sun Belt) outgained ULM (4-6, 3-3) 535 yards to 300, but the Panthers hurt themselves with two turnovers and allowed a blocked punt for a touchdown.

Darren Grainger passed for a career-high 349 yards and one touchdown and rushed for 50 yards and another score.

Junior Marcus Carroll had his second-straight 100-yard rushing effort with an even 100 on 28 carries. Tucker Gregg rushed for two touchdowns to give him 27 for his career to become Georgia State's career leader in touchdowns scored, passing Albert Wilson (26).

Jamari Thrash caught nine passes for 164 yards, while Ja'Cyais Credle had six receptions for 76 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown.

Georgia State took a 14-3 lead late in the first quarter after scoring runs by Grainger and Gregg, but on the Panthers' next possession, ULM blocked Michael Hayes' punt and Drake returned it 23 yards for a touchdown to pull the Warhawks within 14-10 with 14:16 left in the second quarter.

The Panthers answered immediately with Gregg's second touchdown, this one from nine yards out with 11:20 left in the half. But ULM managed a field goal and then a touchdown late in the half to pull within 21-20 at the intermission.

Grainger's touchdown pass to Credle, which gave the Panthers a 28-20 lead with four minutes left in the third quarter, was the 35th of his career, to pass Dan Ellington and move into second place in GSU history, trailing only Nick Arbuckle (51).

ULM pulled closer as Callum Sutherland's 50-yard field early in the fourth quarter. The Warhawks then drove to the GSU 27-yard line when Antavious Lane intercepted ULM quarterback Chandler Rogers with 7:39 to play. But three plays later, on 3rd-and-5, Grainger was intercepted for the touchdown.

Lane's interception for GSU was the 11th of his career to tie teammate Quavian White for the Georgia State career lead.

## JAMES MADISON 42, GEORGIA STATE 40

**Game 11: Nov. 19, 2022 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+)**

Marcus Carroll's touchdown run with 2:30 left pulled Georgia State within two points, but the try for the tying 2-point conversion was unsuccessful as the Panthers fell 42-40 at James Madison.

The Georgia State (4-7, 3-4 Sun Belt) defense recovered a school-record four fumbles and returned two of them for touchdowns to help the Panthers build a 34-14 lead at halftime, but James Madison (7-3, 5-2) scored four straight touchdowns in the second half to take a 42-34 lead early in the fourth quarter.

The Panthers final touchdown was set up by the defense's fourth fumble recovery of the day as Tre Moore recovered to give GSU the ball at the JMU 45 with six minutes left. Carroll rushed five straight times, and on fourth down at the JMU 28, Grainger found Jamari Thrash for a first down at the 12. Two plays later, Carroll bulled his way into the end zone from six yards out, but Grainger's threw incomplete in the end zone on the try for two.

James Madison recovered the onside kick and ran out the clock.

Thrash finished with four catches for 136 yards in his second straight 100-yard game. Grainger passed for 176 yards on just eight completions with one touchdown passing and one rushing. But the Panthers managed just 81 yards rushing and a season-low 257 yards of total offense.

The Panthers took the lead by scoring on consecutive snaps late in the first quarter. Michael Hayes booted a 51-yard field goal for his career long and the third-longest field goal in school history.



# 2022REVIEW

On JMU's next snap, noseguard Thomas Gore sacked Todd Centeio and caused him to fumble, and Denis scooped and scored for a 21-yard touchdown and a 10-7 lead. That is the second fumble return for touchdown for Denis, who also had one in last year's bowl victory.

After the Panthers forced a punt and took over at their own 32-yard line, GSU had another quick score needing just four plays to travel 68 yards. Grainger hit Thrash for 39 yards to the JMU 29, and on 3rd-and-9, the GSU quarterback scampered around the right end and outran the defense to the end zone for a 28-yard touchdown run and a 17-7 lead with 10 minutes left in the half.

James Madison fumbled the ensuing kickoff and Jordan Jones recovered for GSU to set up Hayes' second field goal of the day.

The Dukes also fumbled on their next possession, and this time Terrell Gordon recovered and returned it for a 32-yard touchdown that put the Panthers up 27-7 with 7:26 left in the first half.

That marks the first time GSU has returned two fumbles for touchdowns in a game. The four fumble recoveries gave Georgia State a school-record 25 turnovers gained on the season.

After James Madison managed a touchdown with 1:28 left in the first half, the Panthers responded on their next play. Grainger took the snap and flipped it to Thrash on a jet sweep. Thrash raced around the right end and all the way to the end zone for a 75-yard touchdown reception and a 34-14 halftime lead.

The 75-yard pass play is Georgia State's longest play of the season, the longest reception of Thrash's career and Grainger's longest pass in a GSU uniform.

Sixth-year senior center Malik Sumter started his 52nd consecutive game for the Panthers, breaking the school record set last season by guard Shamarius Gilmore, who started 51 in a row.

Another sixth-year offensive lineman, right guard Pat Bartlett, played in his 60th game to tie Gilmore for that record.

Jamari Thrash had 10 catches for 157 yards to cap one of the top receiving seasons in program history, but Georgia State suffered another close loss, falling 28-23 at Marshall in the season finale at Joan C. Edwards Stadium.

Thrash's 12-yard touchdown catch gave the Panthers (4-8, 3-5) a 17-14 advantage midway through the third quarter. After Marshall regained the lead with back-to-back touchdowns to go up 28-17 with 5:31 to play, Thrash hauled in a 54-yard bomb down to the Marshall 21-yard line on Georgia State's next play. That set up Marcus Carroll's 2-yard touchdown to pull GSU within 28-23 with 3:45 left. But the 2-point conversion pass was no good, and Marshall (8-4, 5-3) was able to run out the clock.

Thrash, the junior from LaGrange, Ga., recorded the fourth 1,000-yard receiving season in GSU annals, finishing with 1,122 yards on 61 catches. Only Albert Wilson (1,177 in 2013) had more yards for the Panthers.

GSU quarterback Darren Grainger completed 20-of-27 passes for 303 yards and one touchdown, but he was sacked seven times, as the Panthers finished with only 62 yards rushing.

Super senior offensive guard Pat Bartlett played in his school-record 61st game for the Panthers, while center Malik Sumter, another super senior, started his school-record 53rd straight contest while appearing in his 58th game.

"I can't say enough about this group of seniors who made such a difference in our football program," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "These guys made a commitment to our football program, and they had to believe in what we were doing. They've seen as much success by Georgia State football as there's ever been, and without those guys, we couldn't have

accomplished anything. That's why it's so unfortunate that it had to end the way it did."

Georgia State jumped out to a quick lead as Grainger connected with tight end Kris Byrd for a 55-yard completion down to the Marshall 20 on the first play of the game. That set up a 3-yard scoring run by another super senior, Tucker Gregg, who scored his 12th touchdown of 2022 to tie the Panthers' season record, set by Tra Barnett in 2019. That was the 28th career touchdown for Gregg, who already held that record.

The GSU defense forced a pair of missed field goals by Marshall, and in between, Michael Hayes booted a 33-yard field goal for a 10-0 led midway through the first half.

"We all understand it was a very disappointing year for us," said Elliott, whose squad suffered four losses by a total of 11 points to snap their string of three straight winning seasons and bowl games. "We just could not finish games this year."

### FIRST BOWL GAME

#### 2015 AutoNation Cure Bowl

San Jose State 27, Georgia State 16  
Dec. 19, 2015 • Orlando, Fla.



The first bowl game in Georgia State history was a trip to the inaugural AutoNation Cure Bowl in Orlando, Fla., as the program earned a bowl berth in just its sixth year of existence and second at the FBS level.

To reach their first post-season game, the Panthers had to recover from a 2-6 start and win their final four games. The winning streak began with a convincing 41-19 victory at Texas State and continued with home wins over South Alabama and Troy. The underdog Panthers then capped the regular season with a dominating 34-7 victory at rival Georgia Southern for their bowl-clinching sixth victory.

Against San Jose State, Georgia State's late rally fell short as the Panthers lost 27-16.

Sun Belt Player of the Year Nick Arbuckle was held to just 14-of-29 passing for 208 yards and two touchdowns but still finished the season with a Sun Belt Conference single-season record of 4,368 yards.

With Georgia State trailing 13-7 early in the fourth quarter, Wil Lutz uncorked a 70-yard punt that rolled inside the SJSU 5, and the Panther defense forced a three-and-out. On the Spartans punt from the end zone,

a poor snap gave GSU a safety, pulling the Panthers within 13-9 with 12:44 left.

After the free kick and a 24-yard return by Donovan Harden, the Panthers took over at the SJSU 36. Arbuckle hit freshman tight end Ari Werts for a first down at the 20, and two plays later Todd Boyd caught a short pass and raced 19 yards for the score. That gave Georgia State its first lead at 16-13 with 10:46 left.

But San Jose State regained the lead with a quick touchdown on a 42-yard touchdown run by quarterback Kenny Potter, moving the Spartans back in front, 20-16, with nine minutes to go.

Georgia State moved to midfield but failed to convert a 3rd-and-one with eight minutes left. The Panthers went for it on fourth down, and freshman receiver Penny Hart got behind the defense, but Arbuckle's pass was just out of his reach.

The Spartans took over and held the ball for more than five minutes before scoring the clinching touchdown for the final margin.

### FIRST BOWL WIN

#### 2017 AutoNation Cure Bowl

Georgia State 27, Western Kentucky 17  
Dec. 16, 2017 • Orlando, Fla.



Led by Most Valuable Player Conner Manning and a record-setting effort by the defense, Georgia State earned the first bowl victory in school history with a 27-17 win over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl at Camping World Stadium.

The win gave the Panthers their school-record seventh victory of the season under first-year head coach Shawn Elliott and secured their first winning season as an FBS program.

"We're just a bunch of misfit players and misfit coaches who are blue collar, work hard and love one other and look at us," Elliott said. "First bowl win, most wins in school history - I'm damn proud to be a Georgia State Panther, I know that!"

Manning, the senior signal-caller, completed 20 of 28 passes for 276 yards and one touchdown while directing a GSU offense that also rushed for 143 yards. Georgia State accomplished that while essentially playing without top weapon Penny Hart, who was battling an ankle injury and was limited to a handful of snaps.

“Coming into this season, my only goal was to lead this team to a bowl victory,” Manning said as he accepted the MVP award.

The Georgia State defense limited Western Kentucky’s high-powered offense to 349 yards. With six sacks, including two by senior Mackendy Cheridor, the Panthers set a school record by holding WKU to a net of minus-two yards rushing.

Leading 13-10, the Panthers used a flea flicker to take a 10-point lead in the third quarter. After two flips, Manning got the ball back and found freshman tight end Roger Carter all alone down the left sideline for a 42-yard touchdown and a 20-10 advantage with 5:55 left in the third quarter. The score was set up by Hart’s lone catch of the game, a spectacular 27-yard grab at the WKU 42-yard line.

In the fourth quarter, the Panthers effectively sealed the game with a 16-play, 74-yard drive that lasted nine minutes. The drive started after Jerome Smith’s interception, and Kyler Neal tallied the clinching score on a 1-yard run to put GSU ahead 27-10 with 5:50 to play.

Georgia State scored on its opening possession on Brandon Wright’s 42-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

Then the teams traded quick touchdowns on a total of just five plays. First, WKU needed just two plays to score, including White’s 54-yard touchdown pass to Deon Yelder.

But the Panthers’ answer was almost as quick. Devin Gentry rushed for 10 yards, and then Manning found Tamir Jones down the left sideline for 49 yards to the WKU 26. On the next play, Demarcus Kirk broke through the middle of the line and rambled 26 yards for the score to regain the lead at 10-7 with 6:19 left in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, the teams exchanged field goals as Wright’s second three-pointer, this one from 37 yards, gave GSU a 13-10 lead it would take into the locker room.

Junior linebacker Chase Middleton recovered a fumble and returned it 19 yards and also had a sack and an interception. Mackendy Cheridor forced a fumble along with his two sacks.

Redshirt freshman Jonathan Ifedi had career highs of six catches for 56 yards, while Carter had four catches for 85 yards. Glenn Smith rushed for 73 yards on 23 carries.

## 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl

Wyoming 38, Georgia State 17  
Dec. 31, 2019 • Tucson, Ariz.



Playing in its third bowl game in the last five years, Georgia State fell 38-17 to Wyoming in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl on New Year’s Eve afternoon at Arizona Stadium.

In his final game in a Georgia State uniform, senior quarterback Dan Ellington went 13-for-26 for 156 yards and one touchdown while rushing 14 times for 70 yards and another score.

Ellington led the Panthers down the field for a touchdown on their opening possession with a 6-play, 75-yard drive. He completed a 23-yard pass to Devin Gentry and Tra Barnett had a 7-yard run, but Ellington picked up the rest of the yardage on the ground, despite playing with a torn ACL in his right knee. He had a 29-yard gain down to the 20-yard line and scored on a 4-yard run, his first rushing touchdown since the injury, to give the Panthers a 7-0 lead just two minutes into the game.

Wyoming took a 17-7 lead with two touchdowns in the final two minutes of the first quarter, both set up by Panther miscues in their own territory, first a failed fourth-down attempt and then an interception. The Cowboys added a 51-yard touchdown pass in late in the first half to take a 24-10 lead into the locker room.

Senior Brandon Wright kicked a 25-yard field goal in the second quarter for the 32nd field goal of his career to break Wil Lutz’s Georgia State career record. Those three points also gave Wright the GSU season scoring record with 84 points.

Barnett, Georgia State’s all-time leading, finished with 15 carries for 64 yards.

Georgia State’s receiving corps was led by Cornelius McCoy, who had five catches for 78 yards, including a 44-yard touchdown.

Wyoming was led by freshman quarterback Levi Williams who went 11-for-26 for 234 yards and a touchdown. On the ground Xazavian Valladay rushed 26 times for 204 yards and a touchdown and was the game’s Offensive MVP.

The difference in the game might have been on third down where the Panthers managed to go just 3-of-13, while Wyoming was 11-of-17. The Cowboys twice stopped Georgia State on fourth down in the red zone.

Georgia State saw 19 seniors play in their final game with many having played in two bowl games. Four seniors (Khai Anderson, Hunter Atkinson, Ed Curney and Brandon Wright) were part of all three GSU bowl teams.

### 2020 LendingTree Bowl

Georgia State 39,  
Western Kentucky 21  
Dec. 26, 2020 • Mobile, Ala.



Georgia State used a balanced offensive attack and a strong defensive effort to top Western Kentucky 39-21 in the LendingTree Bowl at Ladd-Peebles Stadium.

Georgia State completed back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in the 11-year history of the program while defeating WKU in a bowl game for the second time, following a win over the Hilltoppers in the 2017 AutoNation Cure Bowl for the program's first bowl victory.

"What a great win! What an awesome evening it turned out to be, finishing the 2020 season here at the LendingTree Bowl and getting a great win over Western Kentucky," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It's awesome to watch our players and coaches fight and persevere through all the adversity this year."

Quarterback Cornelious Brown IV, the MVP of the game, went 16-for-30 for 232 yards and three touchdowns and rushed 10 times for 40 yards, helping the Panthers pile up 484 yards of offense with 227 yards rushing and 257 yards passing.

Running back Destin Coates was named the Offensive Player of the Game with 117 yards rushing--his fifth 100-yard game of the season--and one touchdown. Outside linebacker Jontrey Hunter earned Defensive Player of the Game honors, while placekicker Noel Ruiz was named the Special Teams Player of the Game.

Hunter recorded six tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery, while Ruiz nailed a pair of field goals for the Panthers, who were appearing in their fourth bowl game in the last six years.

The Georgia State defense held the Hilltoppers to 284 yards of offense--one of the top 10 performances in school history--forced three turnovers and added three sacks to its season-record total.

"Our defense was outstanding," Elliott said. "We felt like we had to keep [Pigrome] in the pocket. Our guys up front did a masterful job."

Cornelius McCoy led the GSU receiving corps with five catches for

88 yards and a touchdown, while Sam Pinckney added three catches for 62 yards and a TD.

Just minutes into the game after driving the Panthers down the field 64 yards, Brown was intercepted in the end zone, which the Hilltoppers were able to turn into a 14-play, 80-yard drive, capped by quarterback Tyrrell Pigrome's 2-yard scoring run.

Georgia State responded by scoring 27-straight points, starting with Coates' 11-yard touchdown run to tie the game 7-7 just before the end of the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter, Brown found Pinckney for a 26-yard touchdown with 9:50 to play to give the Panthers a 14-7 lead.

On the following drive, Antavious Lane intercepted Pigrome, Lane's fourth interception of the season that tied the GSU season record. It was also the first interception all season by Pigrome, ending a string of 278 attempts without a pick.

That led to Brown's second TD pass, this one to Jamari Thrash, whose diving 5-yard reception put the Panthers ahead 21-7 with 2:09 left in the half.

Pigrome followed with a second straight interception by Hunter, and that set up Brown's 8-yard TD pass to McCoy to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 27-7 lead.

Western Kentucky scored on the opening drive of the second half on a two-yard run by Gaej Walker to cut Georgia State's lead to 27-14. The Hilltoppers then forced GSU to punt, but Hunter recovered the fumbled punt at the WKU 32-yard line, and Ruiz kicked a 45-yard field goal for a 30-14 advantage.

WKU had one more chance to make it a one-score game with a first down at the GSU 11 late in the third quarter, but after a 9-yard gain on first down, the Panthers came up with three straight stops, including an incomplete pass on fourth down.

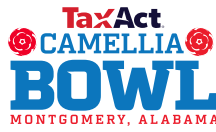
Ruiz added a 29-yard field goal to increase Georgia State's lead to 33-14 with 11:19 remaining in the game. That was Ruiz's school-record eighth-straight made field goal.

With the game in hand, freshman Mikele Colasurdo relieved Brown and found Caddarius Thompson on a 25-yard TD for a 39-14 lead on Colasurdo's first career completion.

The slogan for the TaxAct Camellia Bowl is “History Made Here,” and the Georgia State Panthers did their part with a dominating 51-20 victory over Ball State on Christmas Day at the Cramton Bowl. The Panthers made history with their second-straight bowl win and their school-record eighth victory of the season.

“Christmas is the Happiest Day of the Year, and it certainly was for us today,” head coach Shawn Elliott said after leading his Panthers to their third bowl win in his fifth season at the helm.

“I think we finished Christmas Day with one of the best presents we could have ever asked for and that’s a commanding, dominating win,” Elliott continued.

Quarterback Darren Grainger was named the Bart Starr Most Valuable Player after accounting for four touchdowns. The junior from Conway, S.C., completed 15-of-19 passes for 203 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for a career-high 122 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown run.

Sixth-year senior tight end Aubry Payne had career high eighth receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns, and the Georgia State defense also scored twice—another first in program history—on Javon Denis’ 37-yard fumble return and Antavious Lane’s 55-yard interception return.

Leading 20-13 at the half, Georgia State blew the game open with 31 straight points, including 28 in the third quarter, for their fourth straight win and seventh in the last eight games. The Panthers also won back-to-back bowl games for the first time.

“We’d never won eight games, never won back-to-back bowl games. I say this a lot ... anytime you do something for the first time, do you know what that feels like?” Elliott said. “Every single player and coach in that locker room just did something that had not been done before at Georgia State.”

Trailing 7-0 early, Georgia State got on the board with a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, capped by Grainger’s 18-yard TD pass to Payne to tie the game at 7-all with five minutes left in the first quarter.

Three plays later, the GSU defense came up with its first huge play of the day as Jamil Muhammad forced Ball State quarterback Drew Plitt to fumble, and Denis scooped up the loose ball and raced 37-yards for the end zone to give the Panthers a 17-14 lead.

Muhammad was credited with a sack on the play, his second of the day and Georgia State’s school-record 36th of the season.

Super senior Noel Ruiz added two field goals to give the Panthers a 20-13 lead at the half.

Georgia State opened the second half with another scoring drive, moving 75 yards on eight plays as Grainger hit Robert Lewis from 10-yards out for the score. Lewis’ first career touchdown gave the Panthers a 27-13 advantage three minutes into the third quarter.

Grainger then broke the game open with a 34-yard touchdown run and then a 16-yard TD pass to Payne, putting the Panthers up 41-13 late in the third quarter. Payne’s second touchdown catch of the game was the 13th of his career to pass teammate Roger Carter for the GSU record for a tight end.

On the final play of the quarter, Lane grabbed his school-record fifth interception of the season and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown and a commanding 48-13 lead.

Ruiz, celebrating his birthday on Christmas Day, added a 45-yard field goal in the third quarter for 51 points, Georgia State’s highest total in a bowl game.

Grainger’s 122-yard effort on the ground put him over the 1,000-yard mark for his career, including his time at Furman.

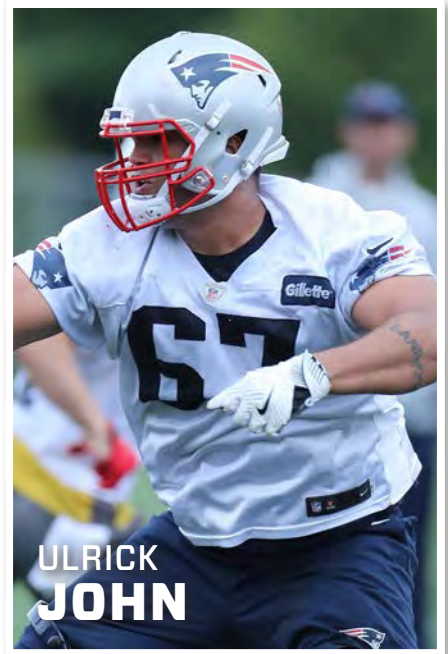

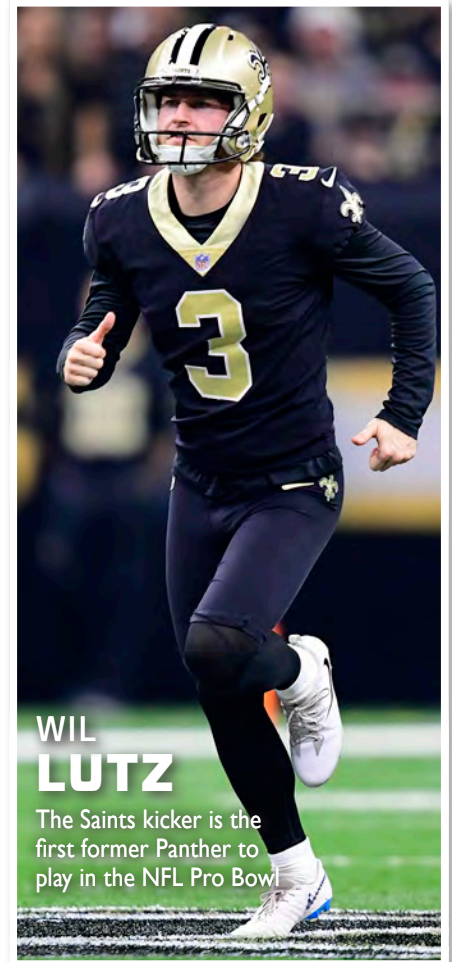
