**Series Notes:** Alabama and Georgia will square off for the 74th time in history when the two teams meet on Saturday night at Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama leads the all-time series, 43-26-4, with the last meeting taking place on Dec. 2, 2023, in Atlanta, Ga. The Tide clinched its 30th SEC Championship following its 27-24 win last season inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium. Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer has never faced the Bulldogs during his head coaching career. Georgia head coach Kirby Smart is 1-5 all-time against the Crimson Tide and is 0-1 in his only other appearance in Tuscaloosa.

**ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY:** The Crimson Tide will be making its 59th appearance overall (37-21, .638) on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show airs live from Tuscaloosa this Saturday. Including Saturday's appearance prior to the matchup with Georgia, Alabama is tied with Ohio State for the most appearances on GameDay by any one program in the show's history. The Crimson Tide's 37 wins entering Saturday stand as the second-most when appearing on the show, trailing only the 40 victories by the Buckeyes.

**DEBOER AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS:** In 14 previous matchups against ranked competition, Kalen DeBoer is 12-2. While at Fresno State, DeBoer's Bulldogs were defeated at No. 11 Oregon on Sept. 4, 2021, marking his first game against a top-25 foe as an FBS head coach. Between stops at both Fresno State and Washington, DeBoer-led teams proceeded to win 12 straight contests against ranked opponents, including six ranked victories in 2023. DeBoer's streak of 12 consecutive wins over ranked programs was snapped following Washington's 34-13 loss to top-ranked Michigan in last season's CFP National Championship. Of note, DeBoer is 4-1 when matched up against top-10 teams.

**THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF SABAN FIELD AT BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM:** Alabama boasts the best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS with an .841 (299-55-3) mark at Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium since its opening in 1929. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (287-63), which opened in 1970, is the next closest in second at .820.

**SEC HOME OPENERS:** Since 2008, the Tide is 15-1 (.938) in SEC home openers. Alabama has outscored its league opponents 635-240 (39.7-15.0 ppg) in those games. The Tide's lone loss in an SEC home opener since 2008 came against Ole Miss on Sept. 19, 2015, by a score of 43-37.

**AGAINST THE TOP 10:** Alabama owns an 85-80-1 (.515) all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press Poll. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 36-14 (.720) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 21-8 (.724) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff.

**BEATING THE BEST:** The Crimson Tide is 80-22 (.784) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. That record includes a 4-2 mark in 2023 with wins against then-No. 15 Ole Miss on Sept. 23, then-No. 17 Tennessee on Oct. 21, then-No. 13 LSU on Nov. 4 and finally against then-No. 1 Georgia in the SEC Championship Game on Dec. 2.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL:** Alabama's No. 4 ranking in the Week 5 edition of the Associated Press Poll marked the 266th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 266 weeks more than doubles second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 119 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 266 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 105 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008:** Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not been ranked lower than No. 17 in 265 polls that have followed. According to the College Poll Archive, the Tide is the only team to be represented on all 266 editions of the poll from the start of the 2008 season to the current week. The next closest team is Ohio State with 251 appearances followed by Oklahoma at 242. Alabama has spent 95.0 percent of the 17-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 82.1 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 109 times since 2008. Only 14 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Georgia at 40 and Clemson in third at 23.

**ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008:** Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 202 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That sum is 21 more than Georgia and Ohio State, the next-closest win totals over that stretch.

**ALWAYS IN THE HUNT:** Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 187 of 193 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 campaign and the final three weeks of the 2022 schedule marked the only six regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 17 seasons.

**HONORING A LEGEND:** Prior to Alabama's Sept. 7 game against USF, The University of Alabama formally dedicated Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium with pregame and halftime ceremonies honoring former head coach Nick Saban. Under Saban's guidance, Alabama was nearly unbeatable at its home stadium that now bears his namesake. Across his 17 seasons in Tuscaloosa, Saban's teams went 108-9 (.923) when playing at home. Of those nine losses, only one was by more than seven points. The Sept. 7 victory over the Bulls stands as the 299th win at what is now Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium (299-55-3).

**FOR DEBOER, WITH A ROAR:** Now 3-0 in his Alabama tenure, head coach Kalen DeBoer has overseen significant success on both sides of the ball with the Tide outscoring its first three opponents by a margin of 147-26. Alabama has also nearly doubled its first three opponents in total offense, outgaining its foes 1400-744 in that span.

**2024 TEAM CAPTAINS:** The Crimson Tide's 2024 team captains were announced after practice on Aug. 20. As selected by their teammates, Tyler Booker, Deontae Lawson, Jalen Milroe and Malachi Moore were each named team captains for the season. It marked the second year in a row for Milroe and Moore, as the duo were voted permanent team captains by their teammates at the end of the 2023 regular season.

## OFFENSIVE NOTES

**PILING UP THE POINTS:** Jalen Milroe has accounted for 14 total touchdowns in only three games of action this season, including eight passing and six rushing. His 14 scores have led to 84 points, tied for the fifth-most in the nation. Milroe's six rushing scores are tied for second-most by any quarterback in Division I while his eight passing touchdowns are tied for the seventh-most in the country. Milroe is the first SEC player since Johnny Manziel (Texas A&M) in 2012 to post 14 touchdowns through three games, and joins Manziel and Jordan Lynch (Northern Illinois) as the first FBS players since 2012 to contribute multiple passing and rushing touchdowns in three consecutive games.

**MILROE'S CLEAN SWEEP AFTER MADISON:** After notching 271 yards of total offense and five touchdowns in the Tide's 42-10 win at Wisconsin on Sept. 14, Jalen Milroe picked up numerous accolades. In addition to being named SEC Offensive Player of the Week, the redshirt junior quarterback was dubbed the Maxwell Player of the Week by the Maxwell Football Club in addition to earning Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week and Reese's Senior Bowl Offensive Player of the Week recognition. Milroe was also selected as a Manning Award 'Star of the Week' and earned Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Honorable Mention acknowledgement.

## ALABAMA IN THE AP RANKINGS

Alabama has been ranked in 878 of the 1,238 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 544-138-8 (.794) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll. Alabama is also ranked in the AP Poll for the 266th consecutive week, topping its previous streak of 105 consecutive polls from 1991-97 under head coach Gene Stallings. The 266 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 34 seasons (1991-present) with US LBM coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2023 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

**PAVING THE ROAD vs. THE BADGERS** Alabama's starting offensive line of Tyler Booker, Parker Brailsford, Elijah Pritchett, Kady Proctor and Jaeden Roberts were named as the Outland Trophy's Players of the Week on Sept. 17 after Alabama's 42-10 win over Wisconsin on Sept. 14. Back to full strength, the UA offensive front put together a dominant showing against the Badgers, finishing with 34 combined knockdown blocks while allowing just one sack and one quarterback pressure on the day. UA finished the afternoon with 407 yards of total offense, including 181 rushing and 226 passing.

**FIVE-STAR REVIEW:** Ryan Williams has made his presence known, as the freshman leads Alabama in receptions (10), receiving yards (285) and receiving touchdowns (4) through his first three collegiate games. For the third consecutive week, Williams led the Tide receiving corps in receptions and yards, totaling four catches and 78 yards with a 31-yard score in Alabama's 42-10 win over Wisconsin on Sept. 14. Williams' 28.5 yards per catch leads all FBS receivers. Among freshmen, Williams shares the national lead in touchdowns while his 10 receptions are tied for third-most. After hauling in two catches for 139 yards and two touchdowns in his collegiate debut against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31, Williams was named SEC Co-Freshman of the Week.

**JAM & JUSTICE:** Alabama's 1-2 punch of Jam Miller and Justice Haynes has proven effective through the first three weeks of the season. The duo have combined for 430 of the Tide's 714 rushing yards (60.2 percent) and five touchdowns. Miller has scored at least one rushing touchdown in all three games, with Haynes crossing the goal line in two of three matchups this season.

**QUICK STRIKE:** The Tide have created a reputation as a big-play offense to start the 2024 season. Of Alabama's 21 touchdowns, 13 have been scores of 20-plus yards (61.9 percent). The 13 touchdowns are split between seven passes and six runs.

**400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE:** Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 68 of its last 86 games, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. The Crimson Tide has produced at least 400 yards of twice this season, most recently recording 407 yards in UA's 42-10 win at Wisconsin on Sept. 14. In the 18 instances where the offense did not go over 400 yards, Alabama is 15-3.

**500+ YARDS OF OFFENSE:** With a 600-yard performance in the season opener against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31, Alabama has eclipsed 500 yards of offense in 58 games since the start of the 2015 season. The Crimson Tide went for 500-plus twice in 2023, first against LSU on Nov. 4 (507 yards) followed by a Nov. 18 win over Chattanooga (574 yards). UA's offense racked up 500-plus yards seven times apiece in both 2022 and 2021, eight times in 2020 and nine times in 2019, with the 2018 roster setting the Alabama single-season record with 500-or-more yards in 12 games.

**600+ YARDS OF OFFENSE:** Alabama totaled 600 yards of offense in the 63-0 win over Western Kentucky to open the 2024 campaign. The 600-plus yard performance marked the 15th instance in program history that the Tide has been at or above 600 yards. The Crimson Tide's most recent instance of 600-plus came on Sept. 24, 2022, when UA posted 628 against Vanderbilt in the SEC opener. Alabama went over 600 yards twice in 2021 and four times during the 2020 campaign.

**40-OR-MORE SINCE 2018:** Alabama has scored 40-or-more points in 55 of the last 86 games. Fifty-five leads the nation for the most total games of 40-plus points since the start of the 2018 season. Ohio State has the second-most instances of scoring 40-or-more points over that stretch at 47, while Oklahoma is third with 40.

**OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** The Crimson Tide has won 54 of its last 55 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came last season on Nov. 25 at Auburn when Roydell Williams rushed into the end zone from two yards away to open the day's scoring. Alabama's lone loss when scoring a touchdown on the opening drive during the current stretch came at Texas A&M on Oct. 9, 2021.

**SCORING STREAK CONTINUES:** Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 313 thanks to Jalen Milroe and Ryan Williams connecting on a 31-yard touchdown pass against Wisconsin on Sept. 14. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 253-60 (.808) record over the course of the current streak.

**BALL PROTECTION:** In the last 222 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 237 times (129 fumbles, 108 interceptions) for an average of 1.06 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 219 times in 211 games (1.03/game). The 219 turnovers since 2009 includes 88 interceptions in 5,592 attempts (one interception every 63.5 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 33 lost fumbles in 5,500 carries (one fumble lost every 166.6 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**KEENAN III NAMED SEC DL OF THE WEEK:** Alabama's Tim Keenan III was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 9 following his standout performance against USF. Keenan III managed personal bests in sacks (1.5), tackles for loss (2.5) and total tackles (9), while also contributing one quarterback hurry.

**KEON, KEEPING ON:** Keon Sabb was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week and the Reese's Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week following Alabama's season opener against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31. Sabb earned the start at safety and played a key role in helping UA shut out the Hilltoppers, recording two tackles and a pair of interceptions with a combined 87 yards on his returns.

**ON QUE:** Linebacker Que Robinson recorded his third sack of the season in Alabama's 42-10 win over Wisconsin on Sept. 14. Robinson has recorded one sack in all three games this season.

**THE AIR IS RARE:** Alabama's defense has surrendered just 347 yards passing through its first three matchups. The Tide's 115.7 yards per game allowed through the air is the seventh-best figure in the country. Alabama is also surrendering just 6.2 yards per completion, the lowest mark in all of Division I.

**THE BUCK STOPS HERE:** Through three games, the Crimson Tide defense has allowed just eight third-down conversions in 49 attempts (16.3 percent), the best mark in the FBS.

**NO CROSSING ZONE:** The Alabama defense is currently surrendering just 8.7 points per game, the sixth-best mark in Division I.

**TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS:** Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 115 of the last 130 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 199 turnovers (127 interceptions, 72 fumbles) and returned 42 of those miscues for touchdowns.

**SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007:** Since 2007, Alabama has recorded 27 shutouts, including 12 in Southeastern Conference play. With its 63-0 win over Western Kentucky on Aug. 31, the Crimson Tide defense has 12 more shutouts than its nearest competitor over that span. Ranking second in shutouts during that time is Ohio State with 15.

**HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE:** Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 372 touchdowns over the last 211 games. That is 51 fewer than second-place Iowa (423).

**KEEPING THE GROUND GAME IN-CHECK:** The Crimson Tide defense limited Western Kentucky to only 42 yards rushing in its 2024 season opener on Aug. 31. Alabama's defensive unit has held 23 of its last 45 opponents (dating back to the 2021 season) to less than 100 yards rushing. UA has also limited 12 of the last 30 opponents to 80 yards or less dating back to the start of the 2022 campaign, including four times in 2023.

**TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND:** Alabama's defense has been a force in the run game since 2007. More recently, the Tide has given up just 96 rushing scores in the last 130 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). Since 2007, UA has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 152, a total that is 27 fewer than second-place Iowa (179).

**BIG LEG BURNIP:** James Burnip has maintained his consistent form through three games. Called upon for 15 punts, Burnip has produced eight 50-plus yard punts, with six boots pinning opponents inside the 20-yard line. Only two of his 15 punts have resulted in returns by the opposing team. Burnip's 46.5 yards per punt is 10th-best figure in the country and ranks third in the SEC.

**HE'S THAT GUY:** Burnip was named the Ray Guy Award's Punter of the Week on Sept. 17 for his punting prowess during UA's 42-10 win at Wisconsin on Sept. 14, as he averaged 49.2 yards per kick over his five boots. Burnip produced a season-long 64-yard kick in Madison, the sixth 60-plus yard punt of his career. The recognition was the second of the season thus far for Burnip, as he was named to the Ray Guy Award "Ray's 8" list following his performance against Western Kentucky on Aug. 31.

SERIES NOTES

**THE ALABAMA-GEORGIA SERIES:** Alabama and Georgia will meet for the 74th time in series history and the first time in the regular season since 2020 when the two teams square off on Saturday evening. The Crimson Tide holds a 43-26-4 all-time advantage in the series and has won eight of the last nine games against the Bulldogs, including three straight victories in regular-season pairings.

**GENERAL NOTES**

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama has seen significant success on the field over the last 17 seasons and that success has coincided with the Tide’s efforts in the classroom. The 2024 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide entered the 2024 campaign with 13 student-athletes who already had their degree in-hand, including: James Burnip, Kneeland Hibbett, Justin Jefferson, Keanu Koht, Jah-Marien Latham, Deontae Lawson, Jalen Milroe, Malachi Moore, Robbie Ouzts, Jaeden Roberts, Que Robinson, DeVonta Smith and Tim Smith.

**CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM:** Alabama’s achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time.

**APR SUCCESS:** According to the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) numbers that were announced by the NCAA in June of 2024, figures that cover the four-year period extending from the 2019-20 through 2022-23 school years, the Crimson Tide continued to score well above the national cutoff standard. The football program’s total average of 997 was tops among all Southeastern Conference schools and finished second among FBS Division I programs behind only Ohio State. In total, the football program was one of 10 University of Alabama teams to lead their respective sport in the SEC in APR numbers with 11 UA squads setting or tying all-time program-high marks for the four-year average. In total, Alabama finished with a program-best 995.5 across the University’s 21 sports in 2022-23, surpassing the previous mark of 995.0 set a year earlier. The most recent report marked the sixth consecutive year of improvement for Alabama’s overall average score.

**208 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 222 GAMES:** The Crimson Tide’s matchup with Wisconsin on Sept. 14 was the Tide’s 208th nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

**ALABAMA vs. No. 1:** Alabama owns the NCAA record for the most wins all-time against the Associated Press Poll’s No. 1 team since the poll was introduced in 1936. The Crimson Tide has compiled 11 wins against the AP’s top-ranked team in program history, most recently against then-No. 1 Georgia in the 2023 Southeastern Conference Championship Game. Prior to that, the Tide downed the top-ranked Bulldogs in the 2021 SEC Championship Game.

**BAMA IN THE NFL**

**LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL:** As of the 2024 NFL Draft, Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 16 drafts (133) than any other program in the nation. The list of 133 features 12 Super Bowl champions, 35 Pro Bowl selections and 14 First Team All-Pro members along with one Offensive and one Defensive Rookie of the Year.

**2024 NFL DRAFT:** The Crimson Tide saw 10 former players selected in the 2024 NFL Draft, including three first-round picks in quarterback JC Latham (No. 7, Tennessee Titans), linebacker Dallas Turner (Minnesota Vikings) and defensive back Terrion Arnold (No. 24, Detroit Lions). The second round featured Kool-Aid McKinstry (New Orleans Saints) and Chris Braswell (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) while Jermaine Burton (Cincinnati Bengals) followed in the third round. Day three began with Justin Eoigbe (Los Angeles Chargers) being selected in the fourth round, followed by sixth-rounders Jase McClellan (Atlanta Falcons) and Will Reichard (Vikings) and seventh-round Jaylen Key (New York Jets).

**QUICK HITS ON ALABAMA'S NFL DRAFT SUCCESS:** Below is a look at some of Alabama's recent success in the NFL Draft.

- Over the last 16 NFL Drafts, Alabama has produced 133 total picks which is more than any other program in the nation. Of those 133, an impressive 47 (35.3 percent) have been first-rounders.
- Since 2000, the Crimson Tide has produced an NCAA-leading 49 first-rounders, a number that is nine better than the next closest school in Ohio State (38).
- Since 2010, Alabama has had an NCAA-best 46 players selected in the first round, a number that nearly doubles the next closest school in OSU (25).
- With the selection of JC Latham in the 2024 NFL Draft, Alabama has had at least one player selected in the first round of 16 straight drafts (2009-present) to set the new NCAA record. The Crimson Tide was previously tied with Miami (1995-2008), who owned the old mark of 14 consecutive first-rounders.
- Alabama has produced multiple first round picks in 13 of the last 16 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

**CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL:** Alabama enters Week 2 of the 2024-25 NFL regular season with 75 players on active rosters (including reserve/practice squad) and is currently represented on 28 of the league's 32 teams. Alabama had 74 total players (including reserve/practice squad) overall and 62 on an active 53-man roster in Week 1, the most of any program in college football. The next closest school for active players was Ohio State with 49 followed by Georgia at 45, LSU with 39 and Michigan at 38 to round out the top five. Below is a look at where former Crimson Tide standouts are playing.

• Kalen DeBoer has produced unprecedented results at every stop of his coaching career. His hard work and dedication to his craft has shaped one of the most impressive resumes in college football after just nine years as a head coach.

• DeBoer's coaching philosophy stresses the importance of class, integrity and academic success. He has a passion for bringing people together while building the total program. DeBoer believes in creating an environment that allows his players to thrive. He holds a deep commitment to developing the young men in his program and investing in them both on and off the field as they prepare for their next steps in life.

• DeBoer and his staff believe in developing players athletically, academically, socially and spiritually so that they leave the program as better men. Beyond winning football games, it is about building a culture within the program that is contagious and producing a team that loves each other and are willing to play for each other.

• There are three non-negotiables in DeBoer's program that have stood the test of time and resulted in stunning success: family, accountability and toughness.

• During his 26 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts across the country, in both coaching and recruiting. In his first nine seasons as a head coach, DeBoer has accumulated a record of 104-12, which includes a 25-3 record in his previous stop with the Washington Huskies and three NAIA National Championships at Sioux Falls.

• DeBoer enters 2024 with a 12-2 record against top-25 teams in his four seasons at Fresno State and Washington. He also boasts a staggering 24-6 record in one-score contests across his first nine years as a head coach, including a 12-2 mark at Washington in one-score games.

• In 2023, he led Washington to the College Football Playoff National Championship Game with a victory over Texas in the Sugar Bowl. DeBoer's '23 group won the Pac-12 Championship and recorded the most wins in a season in program history (14). Additionally, he won the 2023 Associated Press, AFCA, Eddie Robinson, George Munger, Walter Camp, Sporting News and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards.

• DeBoer became the first Washington coach to win 11-or-more games in consecutive seasons after going 11-2 in 2022 and 14-1 in 2023 and the first to win a bowl game in his first season with the Huskies. That success resulted in back-to-back Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors. His Washington squads also went 10-1 against ranked teams, and he is 18-3 in playoff games as a head coach, including his stint at Sioux Falls.

• Along with winning the Pac-12 and the Sugar Bowl during the 2023 season, UW recorded two top-10 wins over Oregon along with victories against No. 12 Oregon State, No. 13 Utah and No. 24 USC.

• In his first year at UW, he led the Huskies to an 11-2 overall record after Washington finished 4-8 the previous year. They posted a 3-0 mark against ranked teams and a win over Texas in the Valero Alamo Bowl. His Huskies swept its three Northwest rivals and finished in a tie for second in the Pac-12, while he was named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year.

• Prior to his time at UW, DeBoer spent two seasons as Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs made great strides on both sides of the ball, posting a combined 12-6 record. Fresno was 4-8 in 2019 prior to DeBoer's arrival.

• In 2021, Fresno State went 9-3 under DeBoer. The 2020 season saw the Bulldogs finish at 3-3 overall.

• Immediately prior to leading Fresno State's program, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He helped guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl. IU's eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense. Indiana averaged 432.8 yards of total offense per game, throwing for 302.4 yards per contest while rushing for 130.4.

• DeBoer joined then-head coach Jeff Tedford as the Fresno State offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2017. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

• A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning titles in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach in 2005. During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

• After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2014 through 2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. plays (99).

• A 1998 graduate of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer was a record-setting football and baseball student-athlete. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions – all school records at the time – and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team.

• He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is tops in USF history, as are his 37 career homers and .944 slugging percentage.
