WELCOMING THE SOONERS

» Auburn (2-2, 0-1) and No. 21 Oklahoma (3-1, 0-1) meet for the first time as conference foes on Saturday, September 28, at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala. ABC will televise the 2:30 p.m. CT SEC matchup; SEC Nation will broadcast live from the green space at the Wellness Kitchen Saturday morning.

Fans are asked to wear orange. Recognitions will include the 2024 NCAA champion men's golf team, the 2024 SEC tournament champion men's basketball team and the winners of the Jack Meagher Award (Charles Barkley) and James Owens Courage Award (Will Hastings).

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 338-274-18 mark (.551) back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 145-70-6 (.669) all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 193-203-12 (.486) overall in SEC play.

SERIES HISTORY

» Oklahoma leads 2-0 in the all-time series with Auburn; both of those matchups came in postseason bowl games. The Sooners were 40-22 winners in the 1972 Sugar Bowl in New Orleans. The teams returned to the same locale for the 2017 Sugar Bowl, which Oklahoma won by a 35-19 score. This will be the first regular season meeting between the schools, as well as their first meeting as SEC rivals.

IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn is 188-64-5 (.741) all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 121-26-1 (.821) all-time at home in September, and 67-38-4 (.631) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 46 of 53 seasons.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- » Auburn leads the country with nine players who have already caught a touchdown pass this season
- » It's the first time in two years, and just the fifth time ever, the Tigers open the season with five straight home games (1982, 2005, 2016, 2022 and 2024)
- The Tigers have 801 all-time wins, 13th-most among FBS schools
- » Jerrin Thompson's interception against New Mexico was the Pop-Tarts Crazy Good play of the week nationally
- » Auburn is seventh nationally in red zone defense (0.571)

- » KeAndre Lambert-Smith ranks second nationally in yards per reception (28.17). His 156 yards against Arkansas was the 14th-best receiving performance in Auburn history. His five receiving touchdowns are tied for fourth nationally and most in the SEC
- » Auburn leads the SEC, and ranks fifth nationally, in yards per completion (16.46)
- The Tigers rank sixth nationally in net punting (45.78) and are one of seven FBS teams whose opponents show negative punt return yards
- » SEC Nation will broadcast live Saturday morning from the green space by the Wellness Kitchen on South Donahue Drive

2024 AUBURN FOOTBALL

The Tigers are 5-4 in games played on September 21, 2-1 in SEC contests and 2-2 in Auburn on that date.

IN THE SEASON OPENER

» Auburn's 73-3 victory over Alabama A&M was a recordsetter all around. It was the ninth win by 70 or more points in program history and the first since a 77-0 win over Erskine in 1932.

The 70-point win is also a Jordan-Hare Stadium record, breaking the old mark set in a 76-10 victory over Chattanooga in 1995, and a 73-7 victory over ULM in 2003.

The 73 points are the second-most Auburn has ever scored in a season opener and the most since scoring 78 points against Marion to open the 1915 season.

Auburn's 451 passing yards rank second in program single-game totals, behind Nick Marshall's 456 yards in the 2014 Iron Bowl.

In the opening quarter, 28 is the most points scored by Auburn since the 2018 Music City Bowl vs. Purdue, and 52 is the most first-half points for Auburn since 56 vs. Purdue in the 2018 Music City Bowl. 49 points ties the largest halftime lead since that Purdue bowl game.

Jarquez Hunter's first-quarter TD with 14:13 remaining was the fastest score at the start of any Auburn game since 2010 against Chattanooga (14:30; pass from Cam Newton to Darvin Adams).

436 yards were the most yards of total offense in the first half by Auburn since 2016 vs. Arkansas State (452).

Six passing touchdowns and five different receivers with a touchdown catch were both Auburn records.

» Seven Tigers making their Auburn debut combined to catch 14 passes for 393 yards and an AU-record six touchdowns in the season-opening win over Alabama A&M. That included nine catches for 268 yards and three scores from four true freshmen receivers. Freshman Malcolm Simmons led the Tigers with 91 yards on three catches, including a 57-yard touchdown, Perry Thompson added a pair of receptions for 82 yards and a 70-yard score, Cam Coleman also caught two passes, including a 44-yard touchdown, ending the game with 62 yards, and Bryce Cain recorded two catches for 33 yards.

Transfer KeAndre Lambert-Smith caught three passes for 80 yards, including touchdowns of 67 and four yards. Transfer Sam Jackson's lone catch in his Auburn debut went for a 37-yard touchdown, while transfer Robert Lewis recorded an eight-yard reception in the Tigers' victory.

ON OFFENSE

» KeAndre Lambert-Smith has caught five touchdowns in his first four games at Auburn.

The Penn State transfer caught touchdowns of 67 yards and four yards vs. AAMU and had a 15-yard score against California. He's the first Auburn player with a TD catch in consecutive games since Rivaldo Fairweather caught a touchdown at Vanderbilt, two at Arkansas and one against New Mexico State last season. It is the third time in his career Lambert-Smith has caught a touchdown in consecutive games; he also did so in 2022 and in 2022-23 while playing at Penn State.

Lambert-Smith had a career-high 156 yards receiving on five catches against Arkansas, including touchdowns of 10 and 67 yards. It was the 14th-best receiving performance in Auburn history.

Auburn's wide receivers caught seven touchdowns in the first two games of the season, which matched the total for the Tiger receivers for the entire 2023 season.

Quarterback Payton Thorne was 13-21 passing against Alabama A&M, with four touchdown passes and 322 yards passing, best of his Auburn career. His 70-yard TD pass to Perry Thompson was Thorne's Iongest completion at Auburn. He added a TD run as well against the Bulldogs. He had a TD run and pass against California.

Thorne is the 10th active FBS quarterback with 700 career completions.

Thorne was 162-265 passing last season for 1,755 yards and 16 touchdowns. He also added 519 yards and 3 scores on the ground to rank 10th in single-season rushing yardage among Auburn QBs.

A Michigan State transfer, Thorne threw for 6,494 yards (223.9 per game) in three seasons with the Spartans. He was 524-860 (.609) in 29 career games, 26 as the starter.

Quarterback Hank Brown made his first start against New Mexico, going 17-25 for 235 passing yards with four touchdown passes.

Brown was the first Auburn signalcaller with four TD passes in his first start since Jeremy Johnson (4 TD) vs. Western Carolina in 2013. The redshirt freshman is 27-43 for 403 yards with six TD for the season. He ranks 10th in freshman passing vards for a season at Auburn.

Jarquez Hunter, a 2023 second team all-SEC honoree, has 2,512 career rushing yards, ranking 12th among Auburn career rushers; he had 909 rushing yards in 2023.

He has 19 career rushing TDs; he started the season with a 34-yard score against Alabama A&M and added another against New Mexico, as well as a TD reception.

Hunter had 152 yards rushing against the Lobos, second most of his career and the second most by an SEC player this season, behind Ole Miss' Henry Parrish Jr., who rushed for 165 yards against Middle Tennessee

Hunter is seventh in the SEC averaging 85.0 rushing yards per game this season and second in the league averaging 7.08 yards per carry.

Auburn has scored in 146 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 30.62 ppg (4,471 total points) during that stretch.

Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

The longest streak in program history is 149 games, beginning with a 55-16 victory over Richmond (10/4/80) in Doug Barfield's final season as head coach and lasting until the final game of Pat Dye's 12-year tenure as Auburn head coach, when the Tigers lost 17-0 to No. 2 Alabama in the 1992 Iron Bowl.

Tight end Rivaldo Fairweather ranks eighth in career tight end receptions at Auburn with 47 and ninth in career tight end receiving with 493 yards over the last two seasons. He scored his first touchdown of 2024 against New Mexico.

Fairweather led Auburn in receiving last season with 38 catches for 394 yards and six TD; he broke John Samuel Shenker's single season TE record of 33 catches (2021).

The transfer from FIU had scores last season against California, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt, two at Arkansas and vs. New Mexico State, leaving him one short of tying Philip Lutzenkirchen's Auburn TE record of seven TD in a season (2011).

Auburn has three players on the 2024 roster who led an FBS team in receiving in 2023; only the Tigers and Notre Dame claim that feat.

Rivaldo Fairweather led Auburn with 38 catches for 394 yards and six TDs, while KeAndre Lambert-Smith led Penn State with 53 catches for 673 yards and four scores and Robert Lewis paced Georgia State with 70 catches for 877 yards and seven touchdowns

Lewis has caught at least one pass in 25 straight games, dating back through the last game of the 2021 season at Georgia State.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn is 29-2 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being Malcolm Simmons' touchdown recovery of a Micah Riley blocked punt against Alabama A&M in the season opener.

Last season: Eugene Asante's 67-yard fumble return for a score at Texas A&M, a Jaylin Simpson interception return against UMass and Keionte Scott's 74-yard punt return at Arkansas.

2024 AUBURN FOOTBALL

FOR THE DEFENSE

» Auburn is allowing just 118.8 rushing yards per game through four games, which ranks 46th nationally.

The Tigers held Alabama A&M to 36 yards and California to 99 yards on the ground. It was the first time Auburn held consecutive opponents to under 100 yards rushing since the Tigers held Mississippi State (13), Texas A&M (94) and Western Kentucky (85) to fewer than 100 yards rushing in consecutive games in 2022.

"Preseason all-SEC linebacker Eugene Asante led Auburn in tackles in five games last season and he scored his first career touchdown on a fourth-quarter 67-yard fumble recovery at Texas A&M.

Asante ranked ninth in the SEC in total tackles per game with a team-best 86 stops. He was one of four SEC players with 80 tackles, 8.0 TFL and 5.0 sacks last year.

» Edge rusher Jalen McLeod ranks third in the SEC with 6.5 TFL (1.6 per game). Against Arkansas, McLeod had seven tackles, 2 TFL, a sack and a PBU.

McLeod was Auburn's leading tackler against Alabama A&M, with five stops, two TFL and a sack. McLeod added five tackles and 2.5 TFL against California.

Last season, McLeod had 50 tackles, 10.5 TFL, 5.5 sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He led the Tigers with eight tackles against Alabama and four against Maryland.

McLeod was the SEC defensive player of the week against Arkansas in 2023, recording nine tackles, three sacks, four TFL and a forced fumble, all career highs.

» Sophomore defensive end Keldric Faulk recorded sacks on back-to-back plays in the second quarter against California. The last Auburn player with sacks on consecutive plays was Reggie Torbor in 2003 against Ole Miss' Eli Manning. Faulk finished the game with the Bears with a career-best eight tackles, three TFL and two sacks.

Faulk has recorded 5.0 TFL and 3.0 sacks in three games; both totals surpass Faulk's totals of 3.5 TFL and 1.0 sack from his freshman season in 2023.

Faulk was an SEC all-freshman team selection last season, playing in every game and recording eight starts with 35 tackles.

» Auburn got sacks from Jalen McLeod (2 TFL), Keldric Faulk and Malik Blocton (2 TFL) against Alabama A&M. Zykeivous Walker had a TFL against New Mexico, and McLeod, Dorian Mausi and Jerrin Thompson had sacks against Arkansas.

McLeod was second on the squad last season with 5.5 sacks and 10.5 TFL, followed by Asante (5.0 sacks, 8.5 TFL).

Twelve Auburn players recorded sacks in 2023, and 23 had a hand in at least one TFL.

- » Auburn had 47 former lettermen on NFL training camp rosters, representing 25 different NFL teams
- » Former Auburn lettermen on NFL active rosters who fnished their college careers elsewhere: Byron Cowart (Chicago), Bo Nix (Denver), Malik Wllis (Tennessee)

- » Auburn is 73-39 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 45-15 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 13-18 when it fails to force a turnover.

The Tigers got interceptions from Jerrin Thompson and Antonio Kite against New Mexico, the first time in nine games the Tigers picked off multiple passes in a game. Sylvester Smith and Kayin Lee had interceptions against Arkansas.

Auburn had a 19-game string of forcing at least one turnover snapped against New Mexico State last year.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

>> Auburn ranks sixth nationally in net punting, with a 45.78-yard average.

Punter Oscar Chapman ranks fourth among Auburn career punting leaders with a 43.85 yard average.

Chapman is third among Auburn career leaders with 213 career punts and third in career yardage (9,341 yards). He received weekly honors from the Ray Guy Award against Cal.

Chapman's 71-yard punt against Georgia in 2023 was a career long, tied for the third-longest punt in Auburn history and was the longest punt since 2006.

The Australian now shows 42 career punts of 50 yards or longer; his latest came against California.

Chapman ranked fourth among SEC punters (44.8) last season with 23 punts inside the 20 and 16 of 50 yards or longer.

- » Auburn has converted 133 consecutive point-after kicks, dating back to the second PAT attempt of the 2021 season. Freshman Towns McGough is a perfect 20-20 on PAT this season, (10-10 against Alabama A&M).
- >> Jeremiah Cobb leads the SEC in kickoff return average (28.6 yds/return).
- » Keionte Scott led the SEC in punt return average for the 2023 season, averaging 14.8 yards on 15 returns. That mark ranked him third nationally.

Scott's 74-yard punt return for a touchdown at Arkansas, earning him SEC special teams player of the week, was Auburn's first punt return TD (not blocked) since 2014. He was one of 29 players nationally with a punt return TD last season.

» Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (195) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

- » Against Alabama A&M, Micah Riley's blocked punt and Malcolm Simmons' recovery for a touchdown were career firsts for both; it was the first punt blocked by Auburn for a score since Caylin Newton blocked a punt recovered by Barton Lester vs. Georgia State in 2021.
- Auburn has seven field goal blocks and 10 punt blocks since the start of 2016.
- » Alex McPherson, a freshman All-American and Lou Groza Award semifinalist, set an Auburn record with his current string of 19 consecutive field goals made, breaking Daniel Carlson's previous mark (16).

McPherson is 19-20 for his career on field goals and 49-49 on PAT. He's one of two FBS kickers (Mason Shipley, Texas State) who made at least one FG per game and did not miss a kick last season.

- » Auburn is 116-179-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 54-48-2 at home against ranked teams, 29-78-2 on the road and 33-53-2 on a neutral field.
- "The Tigers are 92-143-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (44-38-2 at home, 29-70-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 60-55-3 overall (30-11-1 at home, 19-34-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).
- » Auburn's record as a ranked team alltime is 334-126-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 191-34-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 142-91-4 all-time.
- When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 82-80-4 (37-14-1 at home, 22-43-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

- » The Tigers are one of six FBS teams, all SEC, that play at least three road games against teams ranked in the preseason AP top 15 and one of four teams that play three road games against New Year's Six bowl game teams from last season, joining Florida, Georgia and Mississippi State.
- » Auburn has an all-time record of 348-96-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .779 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

For the 2023 season, capacity was increased to 88,043 with updates to premium seating.

All home games in 2023 sold out in advance for the first time since 2015. Auburn season ticket sales set a record with 63,500 purchased during the summer, repeated in the summer of 2024, along with

a record student ticket purchase, bringing the total season packages sold to 83,043.

Through the New Mexico game, the Tigers have had 10 consecutive sellouts at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn plays its first five games of 2024 at home, but then the Tigers play three road games: at Georgia (Oct. 5), Missouri (Oct. 19) and Kentucky (Oct. 26) before returning home to face Vanderbilt (Nov. 2).

It's the first time in two years, and just the fifth time ever, the Tigers open the season with five straight home games (1982, 2005, 2016, 2022 and 2024). It is the first time since 2019 and just the second time since 1949 Auburn will not have a home game during the month of October. It's also the first time since 2019 the Tigers will play three straight SEC road games.

- >> In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 265-73-6 (.779). The Tigers have one more nonconference game this season, November 16 hosting ULM.
- » On the 2024 Auburn roster, 44 players have at least one college start to their credit, 24 on offense and 20 on defense.

There are nine Tigers who have started 20 or more collegiate games: 42 KeAndre Lambert-Smith (38 at Penn State); 40 Payton Thorne (26 at Michigan State); 35 Jerrin Thompson (31 at Texas); 32 Dorian Mausi (28 at Duke); 28 Dillon Wade (12 at Tulsa); 26 Rivaldo Fairweather (12 at FIU); 24 Trill Carter (24 at Minnesota); 23 Keionte Scott; and 22 Robert Lewis (20 at Georgia State).

Auburn all-time in overtime: 9-9; Home OT games: 7-4; the last was a 17-14 win over Missouri in 2022;

Road OT games: 0-4; the last was a 39-33 loss at Mississippi State in 2022;

Neutral site OT games: 2-1; last was a 34-31 loss to Wisconsin in the 2015 Outback Bowl;

SEC OT games: 2-7; the last was a 39-33 loss in 2022 at Mississippi State;

Non-conference OT games: 7-2; last was a 2015 home win over Jacksonville State 27-20.

Auburn has had multiple overtime contests in the same season four times: in 2002 (vs. Syracuse and Florida), in 2007 (vs. South Florida and Clemson), in 2015 (Jacksonville State and Arkansas) and during 2022 (vs. Missouri and at Mississippi State).

Since 2001, Auburn is 171-40 (.810) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 227-48-1 (.824) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 566-68-9 (.887) when scoring 20 or more points.

All-time, Auburn is 357-12 (.967) when scoring 30 points, 182-3 (.984) when scoring 40 points, 84-0 when scoring 50 points, 30-0 when scoring 60 points and 8-0 when scoring 70 points.

Captains for 2024 are Eugene Asante, Luke Deal, Jerrin Thompson and Payton Thorne. Deal is a two-year captain, while Thorne, twice captain at Michigan State, is one of three current four-year FBS captains. along with Utah's Cameron Rising and Arkansas State's Justin Parks.

The Tigers are also selecting game captains: Champ Anthony (New Mexico), Damari Alston (Arkansas).

>> Injuries and Oklahoma were too much for Auburn in the Sugar Bowl.

Starting quarterback Sean White suffered a broken forearm on the first drive of the game and Oklahoma ran past the Tigers in the second half in a 35-19 victory in the Superdome.

Running back Kerryon Johnson threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Harris on the last play of the game, but tht was Auburn's first touchdown since the first series of the game. White kept playing after suffering the injury, trying to convince himself and his coaches he could keep going.

X-rays said otherwise.

Malzahn said quarterback John Franklin III also dealt with an arm injury. Jeremy Johnson finished the game.

It was the most points Auburn allowed this season, and not even a 103 rushing game by Auburn 1,000-yard rusher Kamryn Pettway could change that.

The Tigers had surprised the skeptics this year. Auburn, picked to finish sixth in the SEC West in a preseason poll, finished tied for the second-best record in the league, and qualified for the Sugar Bowl as the highest-ranked SEC team outside of the playoffs. Auburn, which won six straight games when most everybody was healthy, finished 8–5, struggling late in the season as the injuries mounted. Oklahoma won its 10th straight game to finish 11–2.

Oklahoma quarterback Baker Mayfield, a Heisman Trophy finalist, simply kept playing, scrambling and throwing touchdown passes. He raised his season TD total to 40 against Auburn.

The first half was a game of starts and stops. There were 11 penalties in the first 20 minutes. Most of them were by Oklahoma. The Sooners cleaned that up in the second half.

Auburn's offense looked good early, mixing things up, moving the ball smartly and scoring on its first drive of the game. Chandler Cox darted in from the 3 to give Auburn a 7-0 lead with 9:04 left in the first quarter.

With White hurt, the Tigers turned to ol' reliable

Daniel Carlson for their next two scores of the first half, a 49-yard field goal to put Auburn up 10-7 with 7:16 left in the second quarter, and a 39-yard field goal about 6 Ž minutes later.

But Oklahoma hit halftime up 14-13 thanks to a 13-yard scoring pass from Baker Mayfield to Mark Andrews, then a 3-yard run by Joe Mixon. Oklahoma outscored Auburn 14-0 in the third quarter, on a Mayfield-to-Dede Westbrook 7-yard pass and a 4-yard run by Mixon. Then Samaje Perine scored on a 2-yard run to make it 35-13 with 12:40 left in the fourth quarter. Perine would go on to become the Sooners' all-time leading rusher in the fourth quarter, passing Billy Sims.

John Franklin III and Jeremy Johnson replaced White in the second half. Oklahoma finished with 524 yards. Auburn had 339.

- Hugh Freeze was named the 31st head football coach in Auburn's 129-year history on November 28, 2022. Freeze holds a 111-56 overall record as a head coach and is 47-28 in conference games.
- With Auburn's selection to the Music City Bowl in 2023, Freeze has now led four teams to a postseason bowl during his career. That ties him for the most schools among active coaches and fifth among coaches all-time. Freeze has guided Arkansas State, Ole Miss, Liberty and Auburn all to bowl games.
- >> The head coach at Liberty from 2019-22, Freeze led the Flames to four bowl games and a 34-15 record. During his tenure at Liberty, he took former Auburn quarterback Malik Willis and developed him into one of the nation's top quarterbacks in 2021.
- Freeze has experienced similar success at each of his head coaching stops prior to Liberty that include Lambuth University (2008-09), Arkansas State (2011) and Ole Miss (2012-16). The Oxford, Mississippi, native led each school to double-digit win seasons, while helping Ole Miss to a top 10 national finish in 2015. His on-field coaching record in 12 years is 111-56.
- Freeze guided Liberty to a 10-1 overall record in 2020 and the team's first-ever national ranking as it finished No. 17 in the country. That season Liberty had the best start in program history (8-0), tied the program record for wins (10) and defeated two Power 5 programs in Syracuse and Virginia Tech. For his efforts, Freeze was a finalist for the George Munger Collegiate Coach of the Year Award that season.
- >> While the head coach at Ole Miss, Freeze led it back to championship form during his five seasons, guiding it to bowl games during three of his five years, including wins in the 2013 Music City bowl and the 2016 Sugar Bowl.
- >> Freeze's time in Oxford was highlighted by a 10-3 campaign in 2015, the program's first 10-win season since 2003. The Rebels won their first four games of the 2015 season, including a 43-37 road victory over No. 2 Alabama, Ole Miss' first win in Tuscaloosa, since 1988.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 88,043, is in its 83rd year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. A record number of 63,500 season tickets were sold before the 2023 and 2024 seasons

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 445 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 347, losing 95 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .781 against some of the best teams in college football.

Payton Thorne accounted for five first-half touchdowns and Auburn kicked off the season with a 73-3 victory over Alabama Á&M at Jordan-Hare Stadium, win No. 800 in program history.

Thorne completed 13 of 21 passes for 322 yards and four touchdowns in the half, adding 49 rushing yards and another TD on the ground before sitting out the second half.

It took Auburn only four plays and 47 seconds to take the lead. After Thorne opened the game with a 12-yard completion to freshman Malcolm Simmons, Jarquez Hunter scored on his first carry, racing 34 yards through a sizable hole on the right side.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out on A&M's first possession, the quick-strike Tigers needed only one play to double their advantage. Thorne stepped up in the pocket and fired deep down the middle to KeAndre Lambert-Smith for a 67-yard touchdown and a 14-0 Auburn lead

Áuburn repeated that winning formula, a three-and-out and a one-play scoring drive, with Thorne finding freshman Cam Coleman on a stop-and-go route for a 44-yard touchdown to put the Tigers ahead 21-0 at the 11:39 mark of the first quarter. The Tigers increased their lead to 28-0 with 2 minutes left in the opening quarter on Thorne's second touchdown pass to

Keionte Scott's 29-yard punt return set up Town McGough's 32-yard field goal to give Auburn a 31-0 lead early in the second quarter. Thorne connected with another member of Auburn's highly touted quartet of in-state receivers, Perry Thompson, for a 70-yard touchdown and a 38-0 lead with 10:10 left in the second quarter.

Alabama Á&M kicked a field goal midway through the quarter, but Auburn added two more rushing scores before the half, Thorne's 4-yard run and Damari Alston's 2-yarder to put the Tigers on top 52-3 at intermission. Auburn tallied 436 yards in the half despite possessing the ball for only 9 minutes and 37 seconds.

The team's mutually agreed to shorten the second half by playing 10-minute quarters. The Tigers scored on special teams when Micah Riley blocked a punt that Simmons recovered in the end zone for a 59-3 Auburn advantage at the 8:25 mark of the third quarter. Hank Brown took over for Thorne in the second half, hitting the speedy Simmons for a 57-yard touchdown

that gave Auburn a 66-3 lead after the Tigers' only possession of the third quarter.

Brown displayed his deep-ball touch on his second drive, teaming up with a leaping Sam Jackson V for a 37-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a staggering 70-point lead. Brown was 3-for-5 for 96 yards and two scores. Holden Geriner played the remainder of the abbreviated fourth quarter.

Auburn started quickly and rallied late but five turnovers proved costly in a 21-14 toss to California Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium

Trailing 21-7 in the fourth quarter, Payton Thorne scored on a 2-yard touchdown run with 6:06 remaining to cap a 75-yard drive

Auburn's defense forced a punt to give the Tigers a chance at an 80-yard game-tying drive with 2:40 to play, but an interception ended the possession after two plays.

The Tigers forced another punt and regained possession with 28 seconds left, but the Tigers' fourth interception ended the opportunity.

For the second straight week, the Tigers scored on their opening possession, gaining 72 yards on three Thorne comple-tions, a 16-yarder to Rivaldo Fairweather, a 44-yard completion to Cam Coleman and a 15-yard touchdown pass to KeAndre Lambert-Smith on third-and-10.

Cal answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive on which quarterback Fernando Mendoza was 6-for-6, including a 19-yard touchdown pass to Nyziah Hunter on third-and-2, tying the score at 7-7 midway through the first quarter.

After the visitors missed a field goal, Cal intercepted Auburn's next play and capitalized on the turnover three plays later to

take a 14-7 lead with a 13-yard touchdown pass on third-and-2 from Mendoza to Hunter. Cal was 7-for-10 on third down in the first half, controlling possession for 20 minutes, 32 seconds

Keldric Faulk made back-to-back sacks late in the half to force a punt that gave Auburn possession in the final minute, but the half ended on a missed 60-yard field goal attempt.

Faulk's consecutive sacks were Auburn's first since Reggie Torbor sacked Ole Miss QB Eli Manning on back-to-back plays in 2003. Faulk led Auburn with eight tackles, including three tackles for loss.

After Auburn's first two drives of the second half began on the Tigers' 2-yard line, the Tigers had better field position at

their 34 after Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, but a first-down interception quickly ended the possession at the end

of the third quarter.

Making his first start, redshirt freshman quarterback Hank Brown threw for four touchdowns to lead Auburn to a 45-19 victory over New Mexico Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium, the Tigers' 33rd consecutive Homecoming victory

Leading 17-13 at the half, Auburn opened the third quarter with a 75-yard touchdown drive that began with Jarquez Hunt-er's 31-yard run and ended with Brown's 3-yard touchdown pass to Micah Riley. Hunter logged his ninth career 100-yard game, gaining 152 yards on 20 carries, an average of 7.6 yards per rush.

Brown completed 17 of 25 passes for 235 yards, completing 68 percent of his attempts, including nine consecutive completions in the second half.

Antonio Kite then intercepted New Mexico quarter Devon Dampier's pass on fourth-and-5, giving Auburn possession at midfield after a personal foul penalty on the Lobos on the return. Two plays later, Brown hit Hunter out of the backfield for a 14-yard touchdown to give Auburn a 31-13 lead with 4:55 remaining in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth quarter, New Mexico pulled within two scores on a 4-yard touchdown pass from Dampier to Caleb Medford on fourth down. The Tigers forced an incompletion on the two-point attempt and led 31-19.

Brown connected with Rivaldo Fairweather for his fourth touchdown, a 26-yard catch-and-run that increased Auburn's

lead to 38-19 with 12:08 to play. Damari Alston closed out the scoring with a 22-yard touchdown run with 5:51 remaining.

After New Mexico kicked a field goal to cap the game's opening possession, Jeremiah Cobb returned the ensuing kickoff a career-long 66 yards and Auburn scored on Brown's 10-yard touchdown pass to Camden Brown to take a 7-3 lead.

The Lobos responded with a 10-play, 75-yard drive, benefiting from a pass interference penalty on third-and-19, then gaining 41 yards on a deep pass and scoring on a 3-yard NaQuari Rogers run to go ahead 10-7. Brown found KeAndre Lambert-Smith for a 50-yard gain that led to Hunter's 2-yard touchdown, helping the Tigers regain

a 14-10 lead Late in the opening quarter, Jerrin Thompson intercepted New Mexico's pass at the Lobos' 33-yard line, Auburn's first

takeaway of the season, leading to Towns McGough's 24-yard field goal early in the second quarter

New Mexico answered with its second field goal to trim the Tigers' lead to 17-13 with 10:01 remaining in second quarter in what turned out to be the final points of the first half.

Late in the half, Alston delivered a 29-yard pickup and the Tigers drove to the Lobos' 18-yard line but a fumble ended the drive.

KeAndre Lambert-Smith made two second-half touchdown receptions but five turnovers cost Auburn in a 24-14 loss to Arkansas Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Tigers' SEC opener.

The Razorbacks turned the Tiger miscues into 10 points while Auburn was unable to capitalize on its two takeaways.

Trailing 7-O after a first half that saw Auburn commit four turnovers and run 25 plays to Arkansas' 43, Payton Thorne took

over at quarterback.

After Auburn's fake punt run failed to pick up a first down, the Tigers' defense delivered its second takeaway courtesy of Kayin Lee's interception

After the teams' traded three-and-outs, Auburn drove 77 yards on six plays for a game-tying touchdown drive. Jarquez Hunter picked up 6 yards on third-and-3, then Thorne hit Lambert-Smith for 54 yards to the Arkansas 10-yard line. Thorne and Lambert-Smith teamed up again one play later for a 10-yard touchdown that tied the score at 7-7 with 5:44 remaining in the third quarter

Arkansas (3-1, 1-0) answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive, taking a 14-7 lead on Taylen Green's 58-yard touchdown pass to Isaiah Sategna on third-and-19. Auburn's fifth turnover, an interception on a tipped pass, led to a 43-yard field goal that gave Arkansas a 17-7 lead with 12:04 to play in the game.

On fourth-and-2 from Auburn's 33, Thorne hit Lambert-Smith on a slant that he took 67 yards to the end zone for a touch-

down that trimmed the Razorbacks' lead to 17-14 at the 9:50 mark. Lambert-Smith caught five passes for 156 yards and two TDs. Needing a stop for a chance for a go-ahead score, Auburn forced a quick third-and-10, but a defensive pass interference penalty gave Arkansas a first down.

On third-and-5, Hank Brown hit Rivaldo Fairweather for a first down at the Arkansas 36. On the next play, Damari Alston raced to his left and sprinted inside the 10-yard line but a Razorback defender forced a fumble and Arkansas recovered in the end zone for a touchback. Auburn forced a three-and-out and regained possession with 57 second remaining in the half, but an interception gave the Razorbacks the ball at Auburn's 23.


