WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This is the 46th meeting between the Rebels and Wildcats ... The Rebels lead the series 29-14-1 after vacated wins.
- Saturday is the 97th Homecoming game at Ole Miss since 1924 ... The Rebels are 73-16.2 (.813) on Homecoming.
- Ole Miss is 2-2 all-time against Kentucky on Homecoming, with wins coming in 1947 (14-7) and 2022 (22-19).
- Saturday also marks the third Stripe the Vaught game ... Ole Miss is 2-0 in Stripe Out games.
- Head coach **Lane Kiffin** stands at 99 career victories entering Saturday ... He is 38-15 in his fifth season at Ole Miss.
- Ole Miss is 24-2 at home since 2021, which includes each of its last 10 since the 2022 Egg Bowl ... The Rebels are 302-115-8 all-time on the field at Vaught-Hemingway (before vacated wins).
- In that home winning streak, Ole Miss is outscoring opponents by 32.9 points, averaging 575.1 yards and an average capacity crowd of 64,608 at Vaught-Hemingway.
- The Rebels are 33-10 overall since 2021 and rank third among all SEC schools in wins in that span.
- Ole Miss leads the FBS in 10 different statistical categories across both offense and defense.
- Ole Miss has scored a school record 220 points through its first four games.
- It took 195:48 of game time for Ole Miss to allow a touchdown, the longest stretch to open a season since 1959.
- Ole Miss leads the FBS in rushing defense at 34.5 yards per game, with only 8.3 allowed in the first half.
- QB **Jaxson Dart** leads the nation in five statistical categories and is PFF's current top-rated QB at a 93.7 grade ... Dart is one of four active FBS QBs with 9,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards.
- WR **Tre Harris** leads the SEC in four categories, is one of 11 FBS receivers with multiple 200yd games since 2020.
- LB **Chris Paul Jr.** is the top-rated linebacker per PFF in defensive grade (91.4).

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at noon, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season. The number is available through the SEC office at 205-458-3000.

PRACTICES: Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with Learfield (336-831-0719 or cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 6 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on OleMissSports.com and airs on ESPN.

HONORING FOOTBALL LEGEND MONTE KIFFIN: 1940-2024



This season, the Rebels will wear helmet decals in memory of coaching legend **Monte Kiffin**, who passed away on July 11. Kiffin coached football for 55 years, which includes 29 seasons in the NFL where he became known for his prowess as a defensive mastermind -- culminating in a Super Bowl victory with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In recent years, Monte had spent time in Oxford with his son, current Ole Miss head coach **Lane Kiffin**, serving as a mentor to the Rebel coaching staff and as a frequent and delightful sight up and down the halls of the Manning Center and around the Ole Miss campus.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST KENTUCKY

Oct. 1, 2022 • Oxford, Miss. • #11 Ole Miss 22, #7 Kentucky 19: Ole Miss recovered two Kentucky fumbles to preserve a dramatic 22-19 victory. The biggest defensive stop of the game came after UK got the football with 1:49 left to play. Five plays later at the UM 12, Jared Ivey forced a fumble and the Rebels' defense recovered it to seal the victory.

Oct. 3, 2020 • Lexington, Ky. • Ole Miss 42, Kentucky 41 (OT): Matt Corral was 24-for-29 passing with 320 yards as Ole Miss overcame a 14-point second-half deficit to knock off Kentucky, 42-41, in overtime. The Wildcats led 28-14 in the third quarter, but the Rebels scored three unanswered touchdowns. UK responded with a TD to force OT, but the Wildcats missed an PAT in overtime, setting the stage for the Rebel victory.

Nov. 4, 2017 • Lexington, Ky. • Ole Miss 37, Kentucky 34: Receiver D.K. Metcalf won a jump ball in the corner of the end zone for the game-winning touchdown with 0:05 left on the clock. Quarterback Jordan Ta'amu was 31-for-40 for 382 yards and four scores, including two to Metcalf in the SEC road victory.

Nov. 5, 2011 • Lexington, Ky. • Kentucky 30, Ole Miss 13: Freshman Nickolas Brassell totaled 96 all-purpose yards and a touchdown, but Ole Miss fell to Kentucky 30-13 at Commonwealth Stadium. Ole Miss used two field goals (31, 37) by junior Bryson Rose to take a 6-0 lead after the first quarter but UK scored 20 points in the fourth quarter to close out the win.

Oct. 2, 2010 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 42, Kentucky 35: Quarterback Jeremiah Masoli wasn't amazing, but thanks to some help from his defense, he was certainly opportunistic as Ole Miss beat Kentucky 42-35. Ole Miss pulled away in the second half, putting together drives of 75 and 60 yards, respectively, to take a 35-20 lead by the end of the third quarter. The Rebels added another touchdown early in the fourth quarter on a 4-yard pass from Masoli to Ferbia Allen for a 42-20 lead. Ole Miss' Brandon Bolden rushed for 108 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries. It was his first 100-yard rushing game against an SEC opponent.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his fifth season at Ole Miss and has led the Rebels to four consecutive bowl berths, including two New Year's Six appearances, under his guidance since 2020. In 11 years at the NCAA level, Kiffin has posted an all-time record of 99-49, including a 38-15 mark at Ole Miss. Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. The Rebels finished No. 9 in both final versions of the AP and Coaches polls, the highest finish overall since 2015 (No. 9 Coaches) and their highest in the final AP poll since 1969 (No. 8). In 2022, Kiffin led the Rebels to the Texas Bowl, thanks to another dynamite offense that ranked No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4) in 2022. Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season in 2020. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

KENTUCKY HEAD COACH MARK STOOPS

Kentucky head coach **Mark Stoops** is currently coaching in his 12th season of college football, all of which have been at the helm of the Wildcat football program. With a career record of 65-67, Stoops has helped to turn around Kentucky football to earning eight consecutive bowl game appearances. Brother of legendary Oklahoma head coach Bob Stoops, Mark's Stoops holds school record for wins (65), home wins (46), SEC wins (30) and wins over ranked opponents (11). Stoops and his staff have been making noise on the recruiting trail. Kentucky's 12 classes under Stoops have ranked in the top 50 by all four major recruiting services, including the 2022 class which was ranked as high as No. 10 by Rivals. Stoops came to Kentucky from Florida State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2010-12. Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. As did brothers Bob and Mike, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry.

WILDCAT SCOUTING REPORT

Kentucky heads into Oxford with a 2-2 record on the season and are 0-2 in SEC play. UK opened conference play with a Week 2 31-6 loss to South Carolina before taking No. 1 Georgia to the brink in a 13-12 defeat. The game vs. the Rebels will be Kentucky's first game this season away from Kroger Field. Georgia transfer, Brock Vandagriff, serves as the primary signal caller for the Wildcats. Vandagriff is completing 58 percent of his passes and has three TDs on the season. Speedster Braion Brown leads the Wildcats with two receiving touchdowns. Kentucky is anchored by a strong defense that ranks No. 6 in FBS in total defense (217.0 ypg), No. 10 in rushing defense (74.8 ypg) and No. 15 in scoring defense (12.5 ppg). Senior linebacker D'Eryk Jackson leads UK with 19 total tackles and three pass breakups on the season. Team captain Zion Childress has a team-high five tackles for loss from his defensive back spot. Alex Raynor has been a weapon for Kentucky's special teams. The Kennesaw, Georgia, native is a perfect 9-for-9 with two field goals from 50 yards or more.

The Rebels are 2-0 in Stripe Out games, defeating the 7th-ranked Wildcats in 2022 (22-19), while besting Arkansas in the follow-up in 2023 (27-20). Ole Miss fans are encouraged to wear either red or powder blue, depending on their section. Fans can visit StripeTheVaught.com to learn more and see the color for their specific section.

HOMECOMING AT OLE MISS

- This is the 97th Homecoming game at Ole Miss since 1924.
- The Rebels are 73-16-2 (.813) in Homecoming games (after vacated wins).
- Ole Miss is 2-2 all-time against Kentucky, with Rebel wins coming in 1947 (14-7) and 2022 (22-19), and the Wildcats claiming victory in 1949 (47-0) and 1978 (24-17).
- Ole Miss has won 24 of their last 27 Homecoming matchups on the field.
- The last Homecoming loss was a 27-7 defeat to Louisiana Tech in 2011.

REBS IN THE POLLS

- Ole Miss currently ranks No. 5 in the Coaches poll and No. 6 the Associated Press poll for Week Five.
- No. 5 is the highest ranking for the Rebels since rising to No. 3 in the 2015 season.
- No. 6 was the highest preseason ranking for Ole Miss since 1970, when the Rebels started off at No. 5.
- This year marked the first preseason top-10 appearance for the Rebels since 2009, when Ole Miss opened at No. 8.
- Dating back to 2021, Ole Miss has been ranked in the top-25 in 49 of the last 53 poll releases ... That includes a streak of 29 across 2021 and 2022, the longest streak since being ranked for 41 straight weeks from 2014-16.
- The SEC boasts nine teams in the top 25, including five within the top-10 and four in the top-5.

HOME SWEET HOME

Vaught-Hemingway Stadium has been a safe haven for the Rebels historically, owning a 302-115-8 (.720) record all-time in Oxford before vacated wins (280-112-8), and that's been no different in the **Lane Kiffin** era. Ole Miss is 24-2 in its last 26 home games, and since the beginning of Kiffin's tenure in 2020, the Rebels have gone 24-5 overall at Vaught-Hemingway -- which includes a 14-game home winning streak that spanned Nov. 14, 2020 to Oct. 15, 2022. That streak was among the longest home winning streaks nationally when it was snapped by No. 9 Alabama in 2022. It was also the longest winning streak in Oxford since winning 21 straight games from Nov. 1, 1952 to Nov. 7, 1959. Including a tie to LSU in 1960, the Rebels went unbeaten for 34 games over the course of 12 years (1952-64). Under Kiffin, the Rebels have recorded the first two seven-win homes seasons in program history in 2021 and 2023.

HOT AT HOME

Ole Miss has not lost at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium since the 2022 Egg Bowl, one of only five home losses in the Kiffin era. Since, the Rebels have consistently put on a show for the Ole Miss faithful, welcoming in a grand total of 646,081 fans through its turnstiles -- good for a capacity crowd per game average of 64,608.

AMONG THE BEST

Under Kiffin, the Rebels are among the winningest programs in the FBS. Since 2021, Ole Miss ranks tied for seventh nationally and stands third among all SEC schools at 33 wins, trailing only Georgia (45) and Alabama (39). In that stretch, Kiffin's Rebels are 33-10 overall, with six of those 10 losses coming to top-25 teams -- four within the top-10, and twice against the No. 1 team in the nation.

GOSH ALMIGHTY!

Per ESPN, Ole Miss is the first team in SEC history to simultaneously score 150 points and hold opponents to fewer than 10 points scored through its first three games, and the Rebels have continued to increase that scoring spread at a rapid pace. The Rebels lead the FBS at a season scoring margin of +49.5 points per game -- 2.5 points more per game than next-best Tennessee. Ole Miss also leads in the margin between total offense and total defense at a season split of +431.8 yards per game, far away from next-best Tennessee at +389.8. Among the best scoring and total offenses in SEC history, the 2024 Rebels compare favorably well with where those historic teams stood four contests in.

CHECK THE SCOREBOARD

Ole Miss has scored a school record 220 points through four games against Furman (76-0), Middle Tennessee (52-3), Wake Forest (40-6) and Georgia Southern (52-13). The Rebels hold a season-long scoring margin of +198, which includes a 78-3 edge in the first quarter, a 130-16 advantage in the first half and a 90-6 difference in the second half. On the year, the Rebels have scored on 35 of their 52 total drives with 29 touchdowns.

LOCK THE VAUGHT ENDZONE

The Rebel defense has been stout, currently standing alongside Georgia as the lone FBS programs to not yet yield multiple touchdowns. The Rebels are tied with Texas for the best scoring defense in the FBS at 5.5 points allowed per game and rank tied for third in total points allowed at 22 behind Georgia (18) and Ohio State (20). Ole Miss allowed its first touchdown of the season at the 14:12 mark of the second quarter to Georgia Southern on a halfback pass, ending its touchdown-less streak at 195:48 of game time -- the longest such streak by a Rebel defense since 1959, when Ole Miss shut out eight of its 11 opponents and only gave up 21 points all season long.

TOUGH SLEDDING

No opponent has been able to break 50 yards rushing against Ole Miss, which leads all FBS schools at a paltry 34.5 rushing yards allowed per game. In the first half alone, opposing offenses have struggled mightily, combining for just 33 rushing yards and 0.6 yards per carry. On the season, the Rebels have only yielded 138 yards on the ground, stuffing Furman (26), Middle Tennessee (28), Wake Forest (46) and Georgia Southern (38). In available records, no Ole Miss defense has held four consecutive opponents to fewer than 50 yards rushing in the same season since at least 1969, when reliable game-by-game team stats become available. The three straight sub-50 yard performances to start were the first such streak since 1993, and the two sub-30 efforts by the Rebel defense were the first since the 1999 season.

HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

In the Kiffin era, the Rebel offense ranks as the most prolific in the nation, leading the FBS in yards per game since the beginning of the 2020 season at 511.2 yards per game. In terms of total yards, Ole Miss ranks third in the FBS at 27,096 yards within the Kiffin era. In that same four-year stretch, Ole Miss ranks fifth among all FBS schools in rushing yards per game at 218.0, as well as 10th in passing yards per game at 293.3 -- which makes the Rebels the lone FBS team to rank within the top-10 in both categories.

RACKING UP THE YARDS

Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording three of the top-five and four of the top-10 offensive seasons in school history since 2020. With those big single-season numbers come monster single-game numbers as well. Kiffin owns 26 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 16 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own five of the seven total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as six of the top-eight performances all-time.

DON'T BLINK

Ole Miss is once again running a lightning-quick offense in 2024, currently ranking second in the SEC and tied for sixth in FBS at 22.2 seconds per play. On the season, Ole Miss owns 17 scoring drives under two minutes and 10 under one minute. Included in the latter total are two furiously fast drives against Furman in the season opener: a 7-second drive that featured **Austin Simmons'** first collegiate pass, a 35-yard touchdown strike to **Cayden Lee**, as well as a 9-second score on a 61-yard bomb from **Jaxson Dart to Tre Harris**. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss is 32-6 when scoring first.

HISTORIC NUMBERS

Senior QB **Jaxson Dart** is off to a start not seen by an SEC signal caller since the dawn of the new millenium. Dart is the national leader in numerous passing and total offense categories, but his FBS-leading 1,554 yards passing through four games stand as the most by an SEC quarterback since 1998, when Kentucky's Tim Couch -- eventual No. 1 pick of the 1999 NFL Draft -- put up 1,577 yards in his first four contests. Dart's four consecutive 300-yard outings to open the 2024 season make him one of just two SEC quarterbacks to do so in the last 20 yards alongside Arkansas' Ryan Mallett in 2010. Dating back to his 379-yard performance against Penn State in the Peach Bowl, Dart's five consecutive 370-yard games ranks as the longest streak in the SEC in the last 20 years.

LEAD THE WAY

Senior QB **Jaxson Dart** stands among the more decorated signal-callers nationwide in 2024. Dart is one of just four QBs nationally to own 9,000 career passing yards and 1,000 yards rushing, and just recently became one of just five active in FBS football with 10,000 career yards of offense. Dart owns a career line of 671-of-1,028 (65.3 percent) for 9,245 yards, 64 touchdowns and a career rushing line of 1,136 yards and 14 scores on 292 carries. In a Rebel uniform since 2022, Dart has gone 554-of-839 for 7,892 yards and 55 touchdowns through the air, while racking up 1,093 yards and 12 touchdowns rushing on 270 attempts.

MAIN TARGET

Arguably no receiver has had as big an impact this season as Ole Miss senior wideout and preseason All-American **Tre Harris**, who ranks within the top categories of the FBS on numerous receiving lists. Harris ranks second nationally in receiving yards (628) and receiving yards per game (157.0), third in receptions per game (9.5), sixth in all-purpose yards (157.0) and 10th in receiving touchdowns (4) -- and he leads the SEC in all those categories except receiving touchdowns, in which he currently ranks third. Against Georgia Southern, Harris exploded for 225 yards and two scores on 11 catches, tied for the fifth-best single-game performance in Ole Miss history. Harris is the lone receiver in the FBS with multiple 175-yard games this season, and on the FBS active career lists Harris ranks tied for second in receiving touchdowns (26), fourth in receiving yards (3,130), sixth in receiving yards per game (66.6), seventh in yards per catch (15.8) and eighth in receptions (198). This year, 40 percent of **Jaxson Dart's** completions have gone to Harris.

BIG GAME TRE

Last season, **Tre Harris** set the tone early, breaking the Ole Miss single-game record for receiving touchdowns against Mercer (4) in his Rebel debut. Later in the season, Harris carved the Texas A&M defense for what was then a career-high 213 yards, making him still today the lone Ole Miss receiver with a 200-yard game and a four-touchdown game, as well as one of just six FBS receivers since 2021 with a 200-yard game and a four-score game in the same season. With his new career-high 225-yard effort against Georgia Southern, Harris stands in even more rarified air as only the third Rebel to ever record multiple career 200-yard receiving games, and among his FBS peers, one of 11 to have done so since his career began in 2020.

DYNAMIC DUO

Ole Miss senior wideouts **Tre Harris** and **Antwane Wells Jr.** stand in a league of their own among fellow active receivers, currently sitting as the lone teammate duo at all levels of college football with at least 3,000 career receiving yards. Wells ranks eighth on the all divisions list at 3,092 receiving yards, which includes 1,853 in two superb seasons at James Madison while it was in the FCS in 2020 and 2021. Harris, meanwhile, has amassed an impressive 1,613 yards and 12 scores in just 16 games played at Ole Miss to go along with his 1,517 yards and 14 TD in 31 games played at Louisiana Tech from 2020-22.

GIVE JJ THE ROCK!

Ole Miss senior DT, Wuerffel Trophy semifinalist and Chucky Mullins Award winner **JJ Pegues** isn't just a great defender or a caring member of the Oxford community; he's also the not-so-secret offensive weapon for the Rebels. In his career, Pegues has scored three touchdowns since coming home to Lafayette County: a one-yard receiving touchdown in the 2022 Egg Bowl, and two rushing scores so far this season against Furman and Georgia Southern. Offensive prowess is no stranger to Pegues, though, who was a top-10 prospect nationally coming out of Oxford High School as a tight end before switching to defensive tackle while at Auburn. Pegues' appearances on offense are nothing new for Rebel fans, but what is new this season is his status as the winner of the Chucky Mullins Award, an award handed out annually to a defensive player in honor of the late, great Chucky Mullins. At just two touchdowns for 12 points this season alone, Pegues is already the all-time leading points scorer by Chucky Mullins Award winners, and he is the first winner to score those points on offense. On the season, Pegues owns 11 tackles, 5.0 TFL for 14 yards, one half-sack, three QB hurries and the first fumble recovery of his career.

WELCOME BACK!

Senior RB **Henry Parrish Jr.** is in his third non-consecutive season with the Rebels, but against Middle Tennessee he put up the best rushing game of his career and one of the best scoring outputs in Ole Miss football history. Parrish carved the Blue Raiders for a career-high 165 yards and four touchdowns on the ground on just 14 carries, while also adding one catch for 16 yards. Those four TDs rank tied for second-most in Ole Miss history behind Showboat Boykin's still-standing SEC record seven touchdowns against Mississippi State on Dec. 1, 1951. Parrish's day against MTSU also ranked as the most since Matt Corral found the endzone four times against Tulane in 2021, and the most by a non-QB since Dexter McCluster scored four times against Tennessee in 2009. Of those four scores, three came in the first half, making him the first Rebel to score three in a half since Snoop Conner against Arkansas in 2021. In his career, Parrish Jr. owns 2,484 yards and 22 touchdowns rushing -- 1,243 yards and 12 TD in a Rebel uniform.

CAUSING MAYHEM

The Ole Miss defense has been ever-present in the backfield, currently leading the SEC and ranking third nationally at 43 tackles for loss, as well as atop the SEC and second nationally in total yards lost forced at 165. The Rebels have two games with double-digit TFL this season, the most being a particularly destructive season-opener against Furman, rattling the Paladins for a whopping 16 TFL for a loss of 62 yards -- the most TFL since Ole Miss notched 17 vs. Mississippi State in 2000, as well as the most yards lost since denting Kent State for 76 in 2018. Ole Miss is coming off 35-sack season during its historic 2023 campaign, which marked the first time since the sack became an official college statistic in 1983 that the Rebels have recorded at least 35 in three consecutive seasons. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss has recorded multiple sacks in 38 games, at least 5.0 tackles for loss in 36 games, and at least 4.0 sacks in 20 games. In games under Kiffin with at least 5.0 tackles for loss, Ole Miss is 27-9, and in games with at least 4.0 sacks, the Rebels are 12-3.

FEARSOME FRONT

The Ole Miss defensive line entered 2024 with a considerable amount of hype, and per PFF grades the Rebels have lived up to that pressure brilliantly through the first four games. Among edge defenders, Ole Miss possesses two of the top-10 rated defenders in the FBS in DE **Jared Ivey** (4th, 92.4) and DE **Princely Umanmielen** (8th, 88.2). When switching to interior defensive lineman in the run defense category, the Rebels own two of the top-five rated run stoppers in DT **JJ Pegues** (No. 2, 92.0) and DT **Walter Nolen** (5th, 90.4). Pegues and Nolen even rate well when included edge defenders in the run-stopping category, ranking third and sixth, respectively. Combined, those four have tallied up 39 tackles, 12.0 TFL for 48 yards, 5.0 sacks for 33 yards and 11 quarterback hurries.

INTO THE FIRE

The Rebels put massive work into the portal this past offseason, and nowhere is that more noticeable than on defense, where a bevy of newcomers have immediately made their presence felt. On the year, 29.0 of Ole Miss' SEC-leading 43 tackles for loss have come from newcomers, led by junior LB **Chris Paul Jr.** (6.0 for 20 yards) and DE **Chris Hardie** (3.5 for 18 yards). Paul Jr. is also Ole Miss' current leading tackler at 29 total stops, 2.0 sacks, four QB hurries and two pass breakups. Overall, seven of Ole Miss' top-10 tacklers this season are in their first full campaigns with the Rebels: Paul Jr. (29), CB **Trey Amos** (16), S **Louis Moore** (15), LB **TJ Dottery** (15), S **Jadon Canady** (13), DT **Walter Nolen** (12) and CB **Brandon Turnage** (11).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

The Rebel defensive unit stands among the best in the nation in 2024:

- LB **Chris Paul Jr.** not only leads Ole Miss in tackles (14) and TFL (4.0), but he also ranks as the top LB in the FBS per PFF in defensive grade (91.4).
- Ole Miss has four interceptions on the season, picking off one pass in each game so far ... Recording INTs this year have been CB **Trey Amos**, LB **Suntarine Perkins** and S **John Saunders Jr.** and CB **Brandon Turnage**.
- S **John Saunders Jr.** is tied for eighth among active FBS defenders in career passes defended (30) and seventh in INTs (9).
- DT and Chuckie Mullins Award winner **JJ Pegues** owns 5.0 TFL and three QB hurries to start his senior campaign ... He's currently sixth in the SEC in TFL.
- DE **Princely Umanmielen** leads all Rebels with five QB hurries, and owns 16 total pressures per PFF ... Umanmielen ranks tied for 17th among active FBS defenders in career sacks (17.0).
- On the year, 21 different Rebels have had their hand in a tackle for loss, 11 have chipped in on a sack, 12 have defended a pass in some manner and 13 have contributed at least one QB hurry.

UNBLEMISHED

Jaxson Dart only recently had an incredible streak snapped, going 177 pass attempts without throwing an interception before getting picked off in the third quarter at Wake Forest on Sept. 14. Dart's previous INT came all the way back on Nov. 11, 2023 at No. 1 Georgia in the closing minutes of the first half. In the gap between interceptions, Dart was superb as he charted a passing line of 129-of-177 (72.9%) for 1,843 yards and 14 touchdowns. Those 177 consecutive pass attempts ended up ranking as the fourth-longest streak without a pick in Ole Miss history, the longest since Matt Corral set the program record of 234 across the 2020 and 2021 seasons. Last season, Dart tied the Ole Miss single-season record for fewest interceptions thrown on at least 200 pass attempts with only five picks thrown.

IN THE ZONE

Senior QB **Jaxson Dart** has been excellent during his time as a Rebel, but he entered an entire other category after putting on a clinic against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 7. Dart ended the day 25-of-27 for 377 yards and one TD passing, which included an unbelievable 24 consecutive completions to start the game. That stretch broke the all-time Ole Miss (19; Matt Corral; 2020 vs. Vanderbilt) and SEC (23; Tee Martin, Tennessee; 1998 vs. South Carolina) single-game records for consecutive completions, and when adding his six straight completions to end the Furman game on Aug. 31, his 30 straight completed passes also broke both the Ole Miss (20; Kent Austin; 1982 vs. Tulane (5) and Tennessee (15)) and SEC (24; Tee Martin, Tennessee; 1998 vs. Alabama (1) and South Carolina (23)) records for consecutive completions overall. Dart just narrowly missed out on the FBS record of 26 in a row, set by East Carolina's Dominique Davis against Navy on Oct. 22, 2011. Davis also owns the overall record across multiple games of 36 when factoring in his final 10 completions against Memphis and his first 26 in his record-breaking day against the Midshipmen.

YEAR FIVE OF THE KIFFIN ERA

Ole Miss is in the fifth year of the **Lane Kiffin** era in 2024, and in four years the Kiffin-led Rebels have earned four consecutive bowl bids for the first time since 1997-2000, going to the 2021 Outback Bowl, the 2022 Sugar Bowl, the 2022 Texas Bowl and the 2023 Peach Bowl. Kiffin has already mentored 15 NFL Draft picks, while also turning Ole Miss into a powerhouse both on the recruiting trail and in the transfer portal with numerous top-25 recruiting classes and several of the top-ranked transfer classes of the portal era. At 38-15, Kiffin stands as one of just seven coaches to break 30 wins in Ole Miss history and as the second-fastest to hit the milestone:

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his fifth season at Ole Miss and has led the Rebels to four consecutive bowl berths, including two New Year's Six appearances, under his guidance since 2020.

Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. Kiffin owns the only two 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss history, and alongside legendary coach John Vaught, is one of two Rebel coaches with multiple 10-win seasons overall.

Ole Miss succeeded in 2023 with a balanced attack, finishing within the top-15 in the final FBS ranks in yards per completion (10th, 14.5), passing efficiency (12th, 162.9) and total offense (13th, 461.9), while also leading the nation in fewest turnovers (7) and leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally in turnover margin (+11).

The Rebels once again ranked amongst the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4), helped in large part by freshman running back Quinshon Judkins and his school record 1,567 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns.

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, their highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020, leading the program to an Outback Bowl win over No. 7 Indiana and a 5-5 record against an all-SEC schedule. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranked as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school- and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying and then developing quarterback Blake Sims in 2014. Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

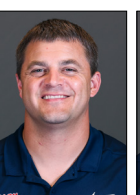

OXFORD, Miss. — Lane Kiffin's No. 6 Rebels dominated Furman from start to finish in a 76-0 Week 1 win. Ole Miss' 76 points were the most in a single game in the Lane Kiffin era and tied for the most since 1935.

Ole Miss outgained Furman by an even 600 yards: 772-172. The Rebels totaled 529 yards through the air and 243 on the ground while holding the Paladins to just 146 and 26, respectively. The 772 yards of total offense were the second-highest total in program history.

Dart put up a full game's worth of stats in just one half. He was 22-for-27 with 445 total yards, six total touchdowns and no interceptions at halftime, and Ole Miss led 52-0 at the break, allowing the Heisman candidate to check out early. Dart became the first SEC QB since Joe Burrow in 2019 with more than 350 passing yards in a half, tallying 418 through the air.

Tre Harris led the way on the receiving end with 179 yards and two touchdowns on eight receptions. Cayden Lee, Caden Prieskorn, Antwane Wells Jr. and Dae'Quan Wright all hauled in touchdown passes as well. On the ground, Ole Miss averaged 6.6 yards per carry with Matt Jones leading the way at 68 yards and two TDs on just three touches.

Ole Miss' defense didn't allow a single red zone appearance and held Furman to only eight first downs in the game and 3-for-17 on third downs. It's the first time since 2014 that the Rebel defense held a team to under 10 first downs.

OXFORD, Miss. — Jaxson Dart made Ole Miss history through the air, Henry Parrish Jr. had a four-touchdown day on the ground and the No. 5 Rebels rolled once again, dominating Middle Tennessee 52-3 to start the 2024 season at 2-0.

Dart completed 24 straight passes to set an Ole Miss record and finish just two completions shy of the single-game NCAA mark. Prior to Dart's assault on the record book, the story was the ground game, where Parrish burned the Blue Raiders for 165 yards and four scores on just 14 carries.

Ole Miss outgained Middle Tennessee 655 to 279 in its 24th 600-yard game under head coach Lane Kiffin. The balanced Rebel attack notched 397 yards through the air and 258 on the ground. The Rebel defense has not allowed a touchdown in two games to start the year and held the Blue Raiders to just 28 yards rushing at a rate of 1.1 yards per carry.

Dart finished 25-for-27 for 377 yards and two total touchdowns, one rushing and one passing. Tre Harris continued his Biletnikoff Award campaign with a team-high nine receptions for 130 yards. Antwane Wells Jr. caught his first touchdown pass as a Rebel and totaled 78 yards as one of nine Rebels with a reception on the day. Parrish averaged 11.8 yards per carry on 165 yards to lead the ground game, while Matt Jones added in his third rushing TD of the season.

Chris Paul Jr., TJ Dottery and Trey Washington tied for the team lead with six tackles apiece. Yam Banks matched Paul with a team-high 1.5 tackles for loss. Banks and Washington each added a pass breakup, while Jadon Canady led that category with two deflections. John Saunders Jr. pulled down the game's lone interception, while Princely Umanmielen logged his first sack in an Ole Miss uniform, in addition to a team-high two QB hurries.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — A myriad of miscues kept Wake Forest in the game, but it was never in doubt as No. 5 Ole Miss was dominant once again in a 40-6 victory in its first road trip of the 2024 season.

Ole Miss raced out a 20-3 lead in the first quarter and never looked back, but it wasn't a perfect outing from Lane Kiffin's Rebels, who were penalized 11 times for 114 yards and turned the ball over twice.

Despite an uncharacteristic number of mistakes, the Rebels still thoroughly controlled the action, outgaining the Demon Deacons 650-311, including just 46 yards rushing by the home team. The Ole Miss defense also forced two turnovers of its own, as well as two turnovers on downs, and held its opponent out of the end zone for the third straight game to start the season as the Rebels have now outscored their opponents 168-9.

Jaxson Dart posted Heisman Trophy numbers once again, going 26-for-34 through the air for 413 total yards (377 pass, 36 rush) and three total touchdowns. Henry Parrish Jr. stayed hot on the ground, amassing 148 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries (6.4 YPC). Tre Harris also continued his Biletnikoff Award-worthy pace, leading Ole Miss with 127 receiving yards and 11 catches. Cayden Lee was next with five receptions for 83 yards, while Antwane Wells Jr. and Jordan Watkins each had long touchdown catches.

TJ Dottery was Ole Miss' leading tackler on the day with eight stops. Louis Moore and Jared Ivey were next with six apiece. Ivey added two sacks and a QB hurry, while Moore shared a sack and recovered a fumble. Suntarine Perkins had an interception and a sack. JJ Pegues combined on a sack, had two QB hurries and a first-down run for good measure.

OXFORD, Miss. —The No. 5 Ole Miss football team closed out a perfect 4-0 non-conference schedule with a dominant 52-13 win over Georgia Southern in front of a record crowd of 67,505 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Ole Miss outgained Georgia Southern 607-194 on the night, holding the Eagles to just 37 yards rushing and 157 passing. The yellow flags were a thorn in Ole Miss' side for the second straight week as the Rebels overcame 11 penalties for 133 yards for a still-decisive victory.

Lane Kiffin's Rebels have outscored their opponents 220-22 through four games. The Ole Miss defense yielded its first touchdown of the 2024 campaign early in the second quarter. The Rebels went 195:47 of game time before allowing their first TD of the season, the program's most consecutive game time without allowing a touchdown since 1959.

Jaxson Dart continued his Heisman Trophy-caliber pace, going 22-for-31 through the air for 382 yards and four touchdowns, adding 36 yards on the ground. Tre Harris was unstoppable as he finished 23 yards shy of the program's single-game receiving record, catching 11 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns. Henry Parrish Jr. once again led the ground game, tallying 89 yards and a score on 13 carries.

Chris Paul Jr. paced the Rebel defense with 10 tackles, including two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Khari Coleman wasn't far behind with nine tackles and a forced fumble. Princely Umanmielen and Walter Nolen were disruptive as usual up front. Nolen totaled four tackles, including a shared sack, and added a QB hurry.
